Monday, March 30, 2009

The House of Representatives of the Twenty-Fifth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2009, convened at 12:07 o'clock p.m., with Vice Speaker Magaoay presiding.

The invocation was delivered by Dr. Stephen L. Swisher of Kenneth Copeland Ministries, after which the Roll was called showing all members present with the exception of Representatives Berg, Mizuno and Takai, who were excused.

By unanimous consent, reading and approval of the Journal of the House of Representatives of the Thirty-Seventh Day was deferred.

INTRODUCTION OF RESOLUTIONS
(FLOOR PRESENTATIONS)

The following resolution (H.R. No. 295) was announced by the Clerk and the following action taken:

H.R. No. 295, entitled: "HOUSE RESOLUTION RECOGNIZES AND COMMENDS DALLAS CARTER AS AN OUTSTANDING ROLE MODEL FOR GOOD HEALTH," was jointly offered by Representatives M. Lee, Morita, Rhoads and Yamane.

Representative M. Lee moved that H.R. No. 295 be adopted, seconded by Representative Rhoads.

Representative M. Lee introduced Mr. Dallas Carter, the grand prize winner of the Beachbody.com's Million Dollar Body Game and commended him on his lifestyle-changing achievements. Accompanying him on the floor of the House were his wife, Mrs. Monica Carter, and their children, Mariah and Dallas Carter, III.

Representative Rhoads also congratulated Mr. Carter and applauded him for being a role model and inspiring other to improve their health.

Representative Rhoads then introduced supporters of Mr. Carter who were seated in the gallery: his boss, Ms. Beverly Sandobal; his coach Ms. Fran Patoskie; and Beachboy team member, Ms. Joanne Chung.

The motion was put to vote by the Chair and carried, and H.R. No. 295 was adopted with Representatives Berg, Mizuno and Takai being excused.

The following resolution (H.R. No. 296) was announced by the Clerk and the following action taken:

H.R. No. 296, entitled: "HOUSE RESOLUTION HONORING FRANK DE LIMA FOR HIS OUTSTANDING SERVICE TO HAWAII'S YOUTH THROUGH THE "FRANK DE LIMA STUDENT ENRICHMENT PROGRAM"," was offered by Representative Ward.

Representative Ward moved that H.R. No. 296 be adopted, seconded by Representative Belatti.

Representative Ward introduced the honoree, Mr. Frank De Lima and thanked him for bringing laughter to the people of Hawaii, and commended him for his 29 years of service through his Frank De Lima Student Enrichment Program.

Representative Ward then introduced Mr. De Lima's friends, Uncle Bobby and Aunt Marian Chun of North Hollywood, California; and Mr. Albert Chee, Jr. of Chevron USA, long-time sponsors of Mr. De Lima's student program.

Representative Belatti, as a former participant of the Student Enrichment Program, thanked Mr. De Lima for his work in inspiring students.

Representative Ching further thanked and commended Mr. De Lima for his work with Hawaii's youth.

The motion was put to vote by the Chair and carried, and H.R. No. 296 was adopted with Representatives Berg, Mizuno and Takai being excused.

At 12:32 o'clock p.m. the Chair declared a recess subject to the call of the Chair.

The House of Representatives reconvened at 12:41 o'clock p.m.

STANDING COMMITTEE REPORTS

Representative Hanohano, for the Committee on Public Safety presented a report (Stand. Com. Rep. No. 1310), recommending that H.R. No. 67, as amended in HD 1, be referred to the Committee on Judiciary.

Representative B. Oshiro moved that the report of the Committee be adopted, and that H.R. No. 67, HD 1, be referred to the Committee on Judiciary, seconded by Representative Evans.

Representative Awana rose and asked that the Clerk record an aye vote with reservations for her, and the Chair "so ordered."

Representative Pine rose and asked that the Clerk record an aye vote with reservations for her, and the Chair "so ordered."

Representative Ward rose and asked that the Clerk record an aye vote with reservations for him, and the Chair "so ordered."

Representative Ching rose in support of the measure with reservations and asked that her written remarks be inserted in the Journal, and the Chair "so ordered."

Representative Ching's written remarks are as follows:

"Thank you, Mr. Speaker. I stand in support with reservations to H.R. 67 – Urging State and Local Law Enforcement Officers to Abide by State Laws Relating to the Medical use of Cannabis. The law enforcement community is well abreast of Hawaii's current medical marijuana laws and I feel this measure might not be necessary. The Honolulu Police Department states in their testimony, "We are well aware of the medical marijuana law of this state and do not need a resolution to remind us of our obligation to obey the law."

"I also have concerns that this bill might send the wrong message to law enforcement. The Department of Public Safety says, "The Department feels that House Resolution 67 is not necessary and derogatory in nature to Hawaii's hard working law enforcement officers. For these reasons the

department cannot support House Resolution 67 and ask that it be held." Thank you."

Representative Marumoto rose and asked that the Clerk record an aye vote with reservations for her, and the Chair "so ordered."

Representative Bertram rose in support of the measure and asked that his written remarks be inserted in the Journal, and the Chair "so ordered."

Representative Bertram's written remarks are as follows:

"Mr. Speaker, I rise in strong support of HR 67. Since the inception of Hawaii's cannabis program there has been a hostility towards the program and the patients by law enforcement. Recent testimony from the Maui Police Chief stated bluntly that he "did not support the program in its entirety".

"There have been dozens of anecdotal and many verified instances of illegal seizures and harassment by local law enforcement. For this worthy program to work patients must have faith that local law enforcement will honor and follow state law. This resolution is one small step in that direction. Thank you."

Representative Tokioka rose and asked that the Clerk record an aye vote with reservations for him, and the Chair "so ordered."

The motion was put to vote by the Chair and carried, and the report of the Committee was adopted and H.R. No. 67, HD 1, entitled: "HOUSE RESOLUTION URGING STATE AND LOCAL LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS TO ABIDE BY STATE LAWS RELATING TO THE MEDICAL USE OF CANNABIS," was referred to the Committee on Judiciary with Representatives Berg, Mizuno, Saiki and Takai being excused.

Representatives Hanohano and Tsuji, for the Committee on Public Safety and the Committee on Agriculture presented a report (Stand. Com. Rep. No. 1311), recommending that H.R. No. 12, as amended in HD 1, be referred to the Committee on Finance.
