A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO TRAVELING TEAM PHYSICIANS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Chapter 453, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is				
2	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated				
3	and to read as follows:				
4	"§453- Traveling team physicians; exemption. (a) A				
5	physician licensed and in good standing to practice as a				
6	physician in another state shall be exempt from the licensure				
7	requirements of this chapter if:				
8	(1) The physician has a written or oral agreement with a				
9	sports team to provide care to team members and				
10	coaching staff traveling with the team for a specific				
11	sporting event to take place in the State; provided				
12	that:				
13	(A) The physician's practice is limited to that				
14	required by the bona fide national sport				
15	governing body, intercollegiate league, or				
16	professional league;				

1		(B)	The services provided by the physician are within
2			the physician's scope of practice; and
3		(C)	The physician has notified the Hawaii medical
4			board of the date the physician intends to enter
5			and practice in the State before the physician
6			enters the State; or
7	(2)	The	physician has been invited by a bona fide national
8		spor	t governing body, intercollegiate league, or
9		prof	essional league to provide services to team
10		memb	ers and coaching staff at a bona fide national
11		spor	t training center in the State or to provide
12		serv	ices at an event or competition in the State that
13		<u>is s</u>	anctioned by the bona fide national sport
14		gove	rning body, intercollegiate league, or
15		prof	essional league; provided that:
16		<u>(A)</u>	The physician's practice is limited to that
17			required by the bona fide national sport
18			governing body, intercollegiate league, or
19			professional league;
20		<u>(B)</u>	The services provided by the physician are within
21			the physician's scope of practice; and

1		<u>(C)</u>	The physician has notified the Hawaii medical		
2			board of the date the physician intends to enter		
3			and practice in the State before the physician		
4			enters the State.		
5	(b)	Noth	ing in this section shall be construed to permit a		
6	physician	exem	pted by this section to:		
7	(1)	Prov	ide care or consultation to any person residing in		
8		the	State, other than a person specified in subsection		
9		<u>(a);</u>	or		
10	(2)	Prac	tice at a licensed health care facility in the		
11		Stat	<u>e.</u>		
12	(c)	Exce	pt as otherwise provided in this subsection, an		
13	exemption	purs	uant to subsection (a)(1) shall be valid while the		
14	physician	is t	raveling with the sports team, but shall be no		
15	longer tha	an te	n days per individual sporting event. Upon		
16	application to the Hawaii medical board and for good cause				
17	shown, the	e Haw	aii medical board may extend the time period in		
18	this subsection up to twenty days per individual sporting event,				
19	for a total of thirty days; provided that no physician shall be				
20	granted extensions that total more than thirty days in a				
21	calendar year.				

- 1 (d) An exemption pursuant to subsection (a)(2) shall be
- 2 valid during the time certified by the bona fide national sport
- 3 governing body, intercollegiate league, or professional league;
- 4 provided that no exemption shall be valid for more than thirty
- 5 days.
- 6 (e) The Hawaii medical board may enter into agreements
- 7 with medical and osteopathic licensing boards of other states to
- 8 implement this section. Agreements may include procedures for
- 9 reporting potential medical license violations."

- 11 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on June 30, 3000.
