SENATE RESOLUTION

ENCOURAGING THE STATE'S COLLABORATION WITH SISTER-STATES ON GLOBAL ENVIRONMENTAL LEADERSHIP.

WHEREAS, subnational governments such as Hawaii are leading 1 2 the way on environmental issues such as pollution, conservation, and climate change, and adopting policies that are far more 3 aggressive than those at the federal or national levels, which 4 are often tempered or prevented by international politics; and 5 6 WHEREAS, the State is committed to the Under2 Coalition 7 Memorandum of Understanding, the United States Climate Alliance, 8 and the Paris Agreement; and 9 10 WHEREAS, the Legislature passed Act 97, Session Laws of 11 2015, which set a goal for the State to achieve one hundred 12 13 percent renewable energy by 2045; and 14 WHEREAS, the Legislature passed Act 15, Session Laws of 15 Hawaii 2018, which established a zero emissions clean economy 16 target, sequestering more carbon emissions than produced 17 18 annually by 2045; and 19 20 WHEREAS, the Legislature passed Senate Concurrent 21 Resolution No. 69, Regular Session of 2014, which endorses and supports the Aloha+ Challenge; and 22 23 24 WHEREAS, countless other subnational governments are working toward adopting similar goals and building clean 25 economies that will catalyze innovation, create new jobs, and 26 provide new opportunities for clean investment; and 27 28 29 WHEREAS, global cooperation on environmental and climate issues has strengthened, with nations and subnational 30 governments convening regularly to forge agreements, trade best 31 practices, and develop clean economic policies at opportunities 32 such as the United Nations Conference of the Parties; and 33 34
