## SENATE RESOLUTION

URGING THE COUNTIES TO IMPLEMENT AND ENFORCE REGULATIONS THAT ENSURE CAR SHARING SERVICES AND OPERATIONS DO NOT NEGATIVELY IMPACT THE TRAFFIC, PARKING, AND CHARACTER OF RESIDENTIAL NEIGHBORHOODS.

1 WHEREAS, visitor industry regulations protect the social, 2 economic, and environmental needs of Hawaii's residents, local businesses, and visitors; and 3 4 WHEREAS, car sharing platforms like Turo enable residents 5 6 to rent out their personal vehicles for short-term use to generate income; and 7 8 9 WHEREAS, persons who use car sharing platforms to rent out their personal vehicles often conduct business directly from 10 their residential properties, potentially requiring a home 11 12 occupation license in at least one county; and 13 WHEREAS, certain car owners park their vehicles in 14 15 residential lots or along neighborhood streets that do not have the capacity to host non-residential vehicles; and 16 17 WHEREAS, when persons who use car sharing platforms to rent 18 19 out their personal vehicles conduct business from their personal residence it can create traffic, noise, and safety concerns 20 within neighborhoods; and 21 22 23 WHEREAS, persons who use car sharing platforms to rent out their personal vehicles violate residential parking space 24 limits, take away parking spaces from other neighbors, and have 25 a negative visual impact on neighborhoods because of their 26 27 excess vehicles; and 28 29 WHEREAS, certain transportation industries, like taxi operators, are required to register with their county mass 30 transit agency and have their business license signed off by the 31



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1 county planning office, who then may grant them additional 2 parking for their lot; and 3 WHEREAS, it is important to ensure that car sharing 4 5 operations do not negatively impact residential neighborhoods, that residents' rights are protected, and that these operations 6 comply with local zoning and business ordinances; and 7 8 9 WHEREAS, if appropriate regulations do not already exist at the county level, the counties should enact ordinances that 10 regulate car sharing services and operations; now, therefore, 11 12 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-second 13 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2023, 14 that the counties are urged to implement and enforce regulations 15 that ensure that car sharing services and operations do not 16 negatively impact the traffic, parking, and character of 17 18 residential neighborhoods; and 19 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that any county regulations enacted 20 21 are encouraged to protect the social, economic, and environmental needs of Hawaii; and 22 23 24 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the counties are urged to limit peer-to-peer ride share parking on public streets as appropriate 25 based on the needs of any given neighborhood; and 26 27 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 28 29 Resolution be transmitted to the mayor of each county, chair of each county council, and director of planning of each county. 30
