A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO TRANSIT-ORIENTED DEVELOPMENT PLANNING.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. The purpose of this Act is to replace the
2	director of law enforcement with the director of corrections and
3	rehabilitation as a member of the Hawaii interagency council for
4	transit-oriented development. The director of public safety was
5	named as a member of the Hawaii interagency council for transit-
6	oriented development when it was established in 2016. With the
7	codification of Act 278, Session Laws of Hawaii 2022, which
8	reorganized the department of public safety, membership of the
9	Hawaii interagency council for transit-oriented development was
10	amended to replace the director of public safety with the
11	director of law enforcement. Since the council advises on state
12	facilities in transit-oriented development areas, the director
13	of corrections and rehabilitation, who has administrative
14	responsibilities for correctional and rehabilitation facilities
15	statewide, is the more appropriate director to serve on the
16	council.
