# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HIGHWAY SAFETY.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that as a gateway
- 2 location between the Eastern and Western hemispheres, Hawaii is
- 3 an international gathering place where peoples from all over the
- 4 world migrate to live, work, and attend school. Hawaii
- 5 residents also migrate to other countries for the same purposes.
- 6 The ability to drive is critical to the quality of life in
- 7 Hawaii and in many other countries. This measure facilitates
- 8 the ability to drive by providing driver licensing reciprocity
- 9 with other countries under specified conditions.
- 10 The legislature further finds that existing law
- 11 establishing the driver's license reciprocity committee is
- 12 cumbersome, costly, and complicated to administer, which
- 13 explains the fact that it has never been used since its
- 14 enactment by Act 314, Session Laws of Hawaii 2012, in spite of
- 15 much public interest in driver's license reciprocity.
- 16 The purpose of this Act is to:

1	(1) Allow a nonresident operator of a motor vehicle who
2	holds a license and international driving permit to
3	operate a motor vehicle in another country to obtain a
4	Hawaii driver's license to operate a car or truck
5	under certain conditions; and
6	(2) Repeal the driver's license reciprocity committee.
7	SECTION 2. Chapter 286, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
8	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
9	and to read as follows:
10	"§286- Reciprocal licensing privileges. (a) A
11	nonresident operator of a motor vehicle who is the holder of a
12	current and valid license and international driving permit to
13	operate a motor vehicle in the country in which the nonresident
14	operator resides is not required to obtain a driver's license to
15	operate a passenger car or truck, as those terms are defined in
16	section 286-2, classified as category (3) under section 286-102,
17	within this State, if the operator does not receive compensation
18	for the operation of the category (3) passenger car or truck;
19	<pre>provided that:</pre>
20	(1) The director determines that the standards of the
21	other country for licensing operators correspond

1		substantially to those of this State and that the
2		other country extends the same privileges to persons
3		licensed to operate motor vehicles by this State; and
4	(2)	The director and the other country have exchanged
5		written agreements confirming the reciprocal extension
6		of privileges to operate motor vehicles.
7	(b)	The director shall publish on the department of
8	transport	ation's public internet site a list of the countries
9	for which	reciprocal operating privileges have been extended and
10	those tha	t have been withdrawn. The most recent list shall be
11	transmitt	ed to the courts, county prosecuting attorneys, and
12	county po	lice chiefs.
13	(c)_	The director may adopt rules pursuant to chapter 91
14	necessary	for the purposes of this section."
15	SECT	ION 3. Section 286-108, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
16	amended b	y amending subsection (c) to read as follows:
17	"(C)	The examiner of drivers may waive the actual
18	demonstra	tion of ability to operate a motor vehicle for any
19	person wh	o:
20	(1)	Is at least eighteen years of age and who possesses a
21		valid driver's license issued to the applicant in any

1		other state of the United States, the District of
2		Columbia, the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico, American
3		Samoa, Guam, a province of the Dominion of Canada, or
4		the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands for
5		the operation of vehicles in categories 1 through 3 of
6		section 286-102; [ <del>or</del> ]
7	(2)	Has completed the same requirements as set forth in
8		section 286-102.6(f) in another state and possesses a
9		valid provisional license from that state[-]; or
10	(3)	The director has granted reciprocal licensing
11		privileges in accordance with section 286"
12	SECT	TON 4. Section 286-11, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
13	repealed.	
14	[" <del>[\$</del>	286-11] Driver's license reciprocity committee. (a)
15	The direc	tor shall establish a statewide driver's license
16	reciproci	ty committee consisting of one representative from the
17	departmen	t of transportation and the chief examiner of drivers
18	of each c	ounty, or their designees. The committee shall convene
19	whenever	a foreign country makes a request for driver's license
20	<del>reciproci</del>	<del>-ty.</del>

1	(b) The statewide driver's license reciprocity committee
2	shall evaluate the written knowledge and practical examination
3	program of the foreign country requesting driver's license
4	reciprocity.
5	(c) Members of the statewide driver's license reciprocity
6	committee shall serve voluntarily and without compensation, but
7	shall be paid reasonable allowances for travel and expenses that
8	may be incurred as a result of the performance of their duties
9	on the committee. The costs shall be paid by the department of
10	transportation.
11	(d) In the event that there is available from the
12	requesting foreign country an evaluation of that country's
13	driver's license requirements prepared by another United States
14	driver licensing agency or the American Association of Motor
15	Vehicle Administrators, the statewide driver's license
16	reciprocity committee shall conduct a comparison review of the
17	evaluation and the State's driver licensing examination
18	standards and submit a written recommendation to the legislature
19	no later than twenty days prior to the convening of the regular
20	legislative session immediately subsequent to the review.

1	(e) If there is no such evaluation available from the
2	requesting foreign country, the director may select from the
3	statewide driver's license reciprocity committee the
4	representative from the department of transportation and a
5	county examiner of drivers representative to travel to the
6	requesting foreign country, at the expense of the requesting
7	foreign country, to inspect and examine the foreign country's
8	driver's license examination program and advise the committee of
9	their findings. The committee shall review the findings and
10	submit a written recommendation to the legislature on whether
11	the foreign country's driver's license examination-standards
12	correspond to Hawaii's driver's license examination standards no
13	later than twenty days prior to the convening of the regular
14	legislative session immediately subsequent to the travel and
15	evaluation by the driver's license reciprocity committee.
16	(f) The director shall adopt rules pursuant to chapter 91
17	necessary for the purposes of this section."]
18	SECTION 5. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
19	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
20	SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect on January 7, 2059.

#### Report Title:

Driver License Reciprocity with Foreign Countries; Reciprocity Committee

#### Description:

Establishes driver licensing reciprocity privileges between Hawaii and foreign countries upon certain conditions. Allows the examiner of drivers to waive the demonstration of the ability to operate a motor vehicle for individuals who receive license reciprocity privileges. Repeals the driver's license reciprocity committee. (SB871 HD1)
