Status

Clarifies that the recovery of overissuances of supplemental nutrition

assistance program assistance and for the recovery of all public assistance overpayments shall be made to the maximum extent

allowable by federal regulations.

HB 1432 Status

RELATING TO THE INTERIM ASSISTANCE REIMBURSEMENT HUS, FIN

SPECIAL FUND.

Establishes the Interim Assistance Reimbursement Special Fund into

which reimbursements received from the Social Security

Administration will be deposited for state-funded financial assistance

payments and programs to assist individuals to qualify for

supplemental security income.

HB 855 Status

RELATING TO VOCATIONAL REHABILITATION SERVICES.

Clarifies that vocational rehabilitation providers are subject to penalties

pursuant to section 386-97.5, HRS.

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<u>HB 1196</u>

RELATING TO HEALTH.

HUS, FIN

Status

Requires an audit of contracts with DHS to provide QUEST expanded access QExA managed care plans to cover eligible individuals who are aged, blind, or disabled with regard to late payments to health care

providers.

HB 779 Status RELATING TO HUMAN SERVICES.

HUS, FIN

Requests the financial assistance advisory council to assist the department of human services in proposing recommendations to restructure the welfare payment system and report any findings to the

legislature.

HB 1236

RELATING TO PERSONS WITH DISABILITIES.

HUS, FIN

Status

Establishes the department of human services medicaid buy-in program for workers with disabilities and appropriates funds for outreach and training relating to the program. Establishes and appropriates funds for a department of health medicaid buy-in pilot program to be effective from July 1, 2016, until June 30, 2018.

<u>HB 1216</u>

RELATING TO CHILD VISITATION.

HUS, JUD

Status

Delétes duplicative provision of awarding grandparents reasonable visitation rights. Adds as prerequisites to awarding visitation that the court find that awarding custody to grandparent is in the best interest of the child and that denial of reasonable grandparent visitation rights would cause actual or potential harm to the child. Clarifies procedures

for awarding visitation.

DECISION MAKING TO FOLLOW
