Aloha Chair Ruderman, Vice Chair Riviere, and Members of the Committee:

I am Christopher Manfredi, President of the Hawaii Farm Bureau Federation (HFB). Organized since 1948, the HFBF is comprised of 1,932 farm family members statewide, and serves as Hawaii's voice of agriculture to protect, advocate and advance the social, economic and educational interests of our diverse agricultural community.

HFB is in strong support of HB 1332 HD 1, which appropriates moneys for maintenance and improvements to the Peekauai ditch irrigation system.

The repair and maintenance of our irrigation systems is critical because our farmers and ranchers depend on these irrigation systems for their operations. Water availability is a basic necessity for farmers and ranchers to maintain and expand their production, particularly in times or drought manifested on many islands as a result of a changing climate. Moreover, a reliable water supply is a key factor when Hawaii's farmers and ranchers are making decisions to start new or to expand existing operations.

HFB would also like to offer additional irrigation systems to be added into this measure. After reaching out to our members, stakeholders, and the Department of Agriculture, a statewide list was assembled with various systems in desperate need of maintenance and repair. HB 502 and SB 584 SD 1, relating to irrigation, outlined an omnibus measure to address systems statewide. HB 502 has unfortunately died in committee and SB 584, SD1 has yet to be scheduled by the Senate money committee. HFB humbly asks this committee to review SB 584, SD 1 and add the additional irrigation systems to this current measure (see attached). Funding these statewide systems will provide needed water supplies to Hawaii's agricultural industry and directly impact the State's goals of food security and self-sufficiency.
