



(August 4TH to October 27TH)




- OLVR transactions = 1,265
- Paper transactions = 6,752
- Total voter registration transactions = 8,017
- OLVR transactions = 15%
- Average OLVR/day (peak days excluded) = 13


City driver's licensing operations (Division of Motor Vehicles, Licensing and Permits) processed 113,127 applications in FY 2013 - Office of the City Auditor report*

Excludes renewal applications transactions from Satellite City Halls and State ID forms

2014

- 19,400 voter registration transactions using the Driver's License form
- 4,800 voter registration transactions using the State Civil ID form
- General estimate: <17% used the driver's license form to register to vote at DMV locations


Absentee Polling Places 2014 Honolulu Hale/Kapolei Hale

Absentee Mail (Outgoing)




Online Absentee Ballot Delivery System for Military/Overseas Voters

Developed in conjunction with the Hawaii Information Consortium .

For use by Uniformed Military and Overseas Citizens to assist with ballot transit issues.

Voters are sent an email notification (containing links) when 'ballots' are available for download.

Voters print and mail the ballot and supporting documents (including a waiver of secrecy).
