Chair Ito, Vice Chair Tokioka and Members of the House Committee on Veterans, Military, & International Affairs & Culture and the Arts:

I am Brigadier General Arthur J. Logan, the Adjutant General and the Director of the Hawaii Emergency Management Agency. I am testifying in support of the intent of House Bill 1076.

This measure will allow the University of Hawaii system to waive tuition for spouses and children of totally disabled veterans and active or reserve members of the armed forces who were killed in action. Many families become financially challenged after the passing of a military member. Families who continue to support totally disabled veterans face similar challenges. This measure will allow spouses and children of these families to attend classes at any school in the University of Hawaii system.
