I am writing in strong support of S.R. NO. 36, which urges the Department of Land and Natural Resources to take action to protect 'Iliahi, Hawaiian Sandalwood.

As practitioners of Hawaii island ecosystem regeneration in our work with FARM Center, we have had the opportunity to survey the remaining *Santalum* populations, photograph them and participate in 'Iliahi reforestation efforts island wide.

It is the mission of the Department of Land and Natural Resources to “enhance, protect, conserve and manage Hawaii’s unique and limited natural, cultural and historic resources held in public trust for current and future generations of the people of Hawaii nei, and its visitors, in partnership with others from the public and private sectors”. Endangered, native 'Iliahi trees are without question, part of this cultural and historic resource held in public trust. Since there remains a market for the export of native 'Iliahi wood, contributing to the threat of extinction of 'Iliahi trees, it is necessary to take action to protect the remaining 'Iliahi trees now.

I urge you to vote Yes on S.R. NO. 36.
