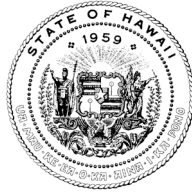

Purpose of Bill: Requires the chief information officer, in conjunction with the information technology steering committee, to review, refresh, and submit to the state information technology strategic plan every 4 years. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD1)

Chair McKelvey, Vice Chair Kitagawa, and Committee Members:

My name is Christine Sakuda and I serve as the executive director of Transform Hawai'i Government (THG), a coalition of organizations and individuals who believe in improving government services and business practices through technology to ensure that policymakers, State employees, local residents and businesses have convenient and secure access to reliable information and data on demand.

THG strongly supports Senate Bill 219 SD1, Relating to Enterprise Technology Services, which requires the chief information officer, in conjunction with the Information Technology Steering Committee, to review, refresh, and submit to State leadership the State information technology strategic plan every four years.

Ever-evolving technology necessitates periodic updates to the State IT strategic plan to ensure that our State is fully maximizing available modern resources in the delivery of services and information to citizens. This measure builds on existing statutorily required duties around the development of the strategic plan (HRS section 27-43(a)) and maintaining and expanding government data availability and transparency (HRS sections 27-44 and 27-44.3). We agree that requiring the plan to be regularly refreshed will promote continuity of services, regardless of transitions from administration to administration.

The commitment of State government leadership to strategic business and IT transformation over the long term is essential to successfully harnessing the power of technology. Benefits include

- increased service quality and satisfaction for Hawai'i's people across all islands;
- elevating the State's workforce so they are able to compete within a 21st Century economy with living wages;
- securing and protecting citizens' data and privacy in the modern era; and
- promoting cost-efficiency, effectiveness, and transparency in the use of taxpayer funds.
