HB 2857 HD1 (SSCR3077)	RELATING TO HISTORIC PRESERVATION. Makes a knowing violation of the conditions of an approved mitigation plan that includes monitoring and preservation plans a civil and administrative violation. (HB2857 HD1)	MAT, JHW
HB 2535 SD1 (SSCR3116)	RELATING TO OFFENSES AGAINST PROPERTY RIGHTS. Amends offense of use of a computer in the commission of a separate crime by including use of a computer to obtain control over the property of the victim or to facilitate commission of the offense of theft in the first or second degrees. (SD1)	MAT/CPH, JHW
HB 1871 HD1, SD1 (SSCR3119)	RELATING TO CONSUMER CREDIT REPORTING AGENCIES. Allows consumers who are victims of identity theft to place a security freeze on their credit reports which will prohibit a consumer reporting agency from releasing any information to unauthorized parties without the consumer's express authorization and will provide consumers more control over who has access to their credit report. HB 2050 HD2, SD1 (SSCR3026)	RELATING TO INTERNATIONAL MATCHMAKING. Adds abuse orders of protection issued against a Hawaii resident as information that must be disclosed by a Hawaii resident as part of the resident's marital history information in dealings with international matchmaking organizations. (SD1)	EIA, JHW
HB 2885 HD2 (SSCR3037)	RELATING TO ADULT ENTERTAINMENT PRODUCTS. Requires that a business selling adult entertainment products obscure them from view from off the premises. Requires that adult entertainment products be segregated and obscured from view from portions of the premises where other products are sold. (HB2885 HD2)	BED, JHW



<p>HB 3126 (SSCR2972)</p>	<p>RELATING TO RAPID IDENTIFICATION DOCUMENTS. Amends the rapid identification documents law by deleting the requirement that the document be in the form of a bracelet. Allows a lawfully appointed guardian, agent, or surrogate to act on a patient's behalf when directing medical staff to provide comfort care only.</p>	<p>HTH, JHW</p>
<p>HB 2192 HD2, SD1 (SSCR3082)</p>	<p>RELATING TO CONTROLLED SUBSTANCES. Clarifies requirements for emergency call-in Schedule II prescriptions, the use of facsimile and telephonic prescriptions, and the use of narcotics to treat addiction. Allows the use of central fill pharmacies and limited information sharing. Adds new definitions. (SD1)</p>	<p>HTH, JHW</p>
<p>HB 2410 HD1, SD1 (SSCR3074)</p>	<p>RELATING TO CONTROLLED SUBSTANCES. Amends statutory provisions to conform with changes to the Uniform Controlled Substances Act enacted in 2005. (SD1)</p>	<p>HTH, JHW</p>
<p>HB 1242 HD1 (SSCR3073)</p>	<p>RELATING TO SECTION 453-16, HAWAII REVISED STATUTES. Prohibits the State from denying or interfering with a female's right to choose or obtain an abortion of a nonviable fetus or an abortion necessary to protect the female's life or health. Repeals residency requirement for abortions. Permits abortions to be performed in clinics and physician's offices. (HB1242 HD1)</p>	<p>HTH, JHW</p>
