SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING CONGRESS TO COMMENCE IMPEACHMENT PROCEEDINGS AGAINST
THE PRESIDENT AND THE VICE-PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES.

1 WHEREAS, George W. Bush and Richard B. Cheney may be in
2 violation of the Charter of the United Nations by launching an
3 illegal War of Aggression against Iraq without cause, using
4 fraud to sell the war to Congress and the public, misusing
5 government funds to begin bombing without Congressional
6 authorization, and subjecting our military personnel to
7 unnecessary harm, debilitating injuries, and death; and
8

9 WHEREAS, George W. Bush and Richard B. Cheney may be in
10 violation of the laws of the United States and International law
11 by authorizing the torture of thousands of captives, resulting
12 in dozens of deaths, and keeping prisoners hidden from the
13 International Committee of the Red Cross; and
14

15 WHEREAS, George W. Bush and Richard B. Cheney may be in
16 violation of the Constitution of the United States by
17 arbitrarily detaining Americans, legal residents, and non-
18 Americans, without due process, without charge, and without
19 access to counsel; and

21 WHEREAS, George W. Bush and Richard B. Cheney may be in
22 violation of the Geneva Conventions by targeting civilians,
23 journalists, hospitals, and ambulances, and using illegal
24 weapons, including white phosphorous, depleted uranium, and a
25 new type of napalm; and

27 WHEREAS, George W. Bush and Richard B. Cheney may be in
28 violation of the laws of the United States and its Constitution
29 through the widespread wiretapping of phone calls and emails of
30 Americans without a warrant; and

32 WHEREAS, George W. Bush and Richard B. Cheney may be in
33 violation of the Constitution of the United States by using



1 "signing statements" to defy hundreds of laws passed by
2 Congress; and

4 WHEREAS, George W. Bush and Richard B. Cheney may be in
5 violation of the laws of the United States and several of its
6 States by obstructing honest elections in 2000, 2002, 2004, and
7 2006; and
8

9 WHEREAS, George W. Bush and Richard B. Cheney may be in
10 violation of the laws of the United States by using paid
11 propaganda and disinformation, selectively and misleadingly
12 leaking classified information, and exposing the identity of a
13 covert Central Intelligence Agency operative working on
14 sensitive Weapons of Mass Destruction proliferation for
15 political retribution; and
16

17 WHEREAS, George W. Bush and Richard B. Cheney may be
18 subverting the Constitution of the United States and abusing the
19 powers of the executive branch by asserting a "Unitary Executive
20 Theory" giving unlimited powers to the President, by obstructing
21 efforts by Congress and the Courts to review and restrict
22 Presidential actions, and by promoting and signing legislation
23 negating the Bill of Rights and the Writ of Habeas Corpus; and

25 WHEREAS, George W. Bush and Richard B. Cheney may be guilty
26 of gross negligence in failing to assist New Orleans residents
27 after Hurricane Katrina, in ignoring urgent warnings of an Al
28 Qaeda attack prior to September 11, 2001, and in increasing air
29 pollution causing global warming; now, therefore,

31 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Twenty-Fourth
32 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2007, the
33 House of Representatives concurring, that the Legislature finds
34 the existence of good cause for the submission of these
35 impeachment charges to the United States House of
36 Representatives under Section 603 of the Manual of the Rules of
37 the United States House of Representatives as grounds for
38 impeachment, trial, and removal of President George W. Bush and
39 Vice-President Richard B. Cheney; and

41 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this
42 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Clerk of the United
43 States House of Representatives Committee on the Judiciary, to
44 Representatives John Conyers and Lamar Smith, the chair and

2 members of Hawaii's Congressional delegation.
