
A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PROCUREMENT.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Section 103D-201, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2 amended by amending subsection (b) to read as follows:

3 "(b) The state procurement policy board shall consist of
4 seven members. Notwithstanding the limitations of section 78-4,
5 the members of the board shall include:

6 (1) The comptroller[+] as an ex-officio nonvoting member;

7 (2) A county employee with significant high-level
8 procurement experience; and

9 (3) Five persons who shall not otherwise be full-time
10 employees of the State or any county; provided that at
11 least one member shall be a certified professional in
12 the field of procurement, at least one member shall
13 have significant high-level, federal procurement
14 experience, and at least two members shall have
15 significant experience in the field of health and
16 human services.



1 Each appointed member shall have demonstrated sufficient
2 business or professional experience to discharge the functions
3 of the state procurement policy board. The initial and
4 subsequent members of the state procurement policy board, other
5 than the comptroller, shall be appointed by the governor from a
6 list of three individuals for each vacant position, submitted by
7 a nominating committee composed of four individuals chosen as
8 follows: two persons appointed by the governor; one person
9 appointed by the president of the senate; and one person
10 appointed by the speaker of the house. Except as provided in
11 this section, the selection and terms of the state procurement
12 policy board members shall be subject to the requirements of
13 section 26-34. No member of the state procurement policy board
14 shall act concurrently as a chief procurement officer. The
15 members of the state procurement policy board shall devote such
16 time to their duties as may be necessary for the proper
17 discharge thereof."

18 SECTION 2. Section 103D-206, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
19 amended to read as follows:

20 **"§103D-206 Additional duties of the administrator of the**
21 **procurement office.** In addition to the duties referred to in
22 section 103D-205, the administrator shall:



- 1 (1) Perform periodic review of the procurement practices
2 of all governmental bodies;
- 3 (2) Assist, advise, and guide governmental bodies in
4 matters relating to procurement[+], including
5 determinations of corrective actions; provided that if
6 a procurement officer fails to comply with any
7 determination rendered by the administrator within
8 thirty days from the date of the issuance of the
9 determination, or longer if permitted by the
10 administrator upon request by the procurement officer,
11 the procurement officer shall be subject to an
12 administrative fine under section 103D-106, for every
13 day of noncompliance;
- 14 (3) Develop and administer a statewide procurement
15 orientation and training program;
- 16 (4) Develop, distribute, and maintain a procurement manual
17 for all state procurement officials; and
- 18 (5) Develop, distribute, and maintain a procurement guide
19 for vendors wishing to do business with the State and
20 its counties."



1 SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
2 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

3 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.

State Procurement Office; Authority

Description:

Requires that any determination of a procurement corrective action be complied with within 30 days or the governmental body shall be subject to an administrative fine; provides the administrator of the state procurement office to extend the 30 day time period; makes comptroller ex-officio nonvoting member of procurement board. (SD1)
