A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PROCUREMENT.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Section 601-3, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2 amended by amending subsection (b) to read as follows:

3 "(b) The administrative director [~~shall~~], subject to the
4 direction of the chief justice, shall perform the following
5 functions:

6 (1) Examine the administrative methods of the courts and
7 make recommendations to the chief justice for their
8 improvement;

9 (2) Examine the state of the dockets of the courts, secure
10 information as to their needs of assistance, if any,
11 prepare statistical data and reports of the business
12 of the courts and advise the chief justice to the end
13 that proper action may be taken;

14 (3) Examine the estimates of the courts for appropriations
15 and present to the chief justice the administrative
16 director's recommendations concerning them;

1 (4) Examine the statistical systems of the courts and make
2 recommendations to the chief justice for a uniform
3 system of judicial statistics;

4 (5) Collect, analyze, and report to the chief justice
5 statistical and other data concerning the business of
6 the courts;

7 (6) Assist the chief justice in the preparation of the
8 budget, the six-year program and financial plan, the
9 variance report and any other reports requested by the
10 legislature;

11 (7) Carry out all duties and responsibilities as the chief
12 procurement officer for the judiciary;

13 [~~7~~] (8) Carry out all duties and responsibilities that
14 are specified in title 7 as it pertains to employees
15 of the judiciary; and

16 [~~8~~] (9) Attend to such other matters as may be assigned
17 by the chief justice."

18 SECTION 2. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
19 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

20 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
