SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

RECOGNIZING THE ARMENIAN GENOCIDE OF 1915.

1 WHEREAS, between the years 1915 and 1923, during the chaos
2 of World War I, one and a half million Armenian men, women and
3 children living within the Ottoman Empire's borders were killed
4 in a brutal genocide; and

5
6 WHEREAS, hundreds of thousands of Armenians were forced to
7 flee to foreign countries after being stripped of their
8 possessions, their national identities and their homeland; and

9
10 WHEREAS, documented as the first instance of genocide in
11 the twentieth century, the Armenian Genocide remains
12 unacknowledged by Turkey to this day; and

13
14 WHEREAS, even though over ninety years have passed since
15 these mass killings took place, present day atrocities continue
16 to resonate throughout the world; and

18 WHEREAS, it is our responsibility to recognize the brutal
19 slayings of so many innocents, remembering their suffering and
20 vowing to help prevent future genocides; and

22 WHEREAS, each year Armenians throughout the world honor
23 those who perished and the entire world's people should
24 commemorate the Armenian Genocide because it stands as an ugly
25 testament to man's inhumanity to man; and

27 WHEREAS, Armenia's ties to Hawaii started in the 1920's
28 with painter Arman Manookian, a genocide survivor, who became
29 known as Hawaii's Van Gogh; and

31 WHEREAS, Hawaii has a growing Armenian-American community
32 that is involved in all aspects of public life, from business to
33 education and government; now, therefore,





1 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Twenty-fifth

 7 forget these horrific crimes against humanity; and





