
SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING A JOINT AGENCY STUDY ON THE IMPACT OF ILLEGAL
IMMIGRATION IN HAWAII.

1 WHEREAS, since 2007, there has been an increased awareness
2 and urgency among business and government to address the issue
3 of illegal or undocumented workers in the country and in the
4 State, many of whom work in the construction industry; and
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6 WHEREAS, it is estimated that, nationally, 1,400,000
7 undocumented workers are employed in the construction industry;
8 and
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10 WHEREAS, in a study conducted in 2005, it was estimated
11 that there were between twenty thousand and thirty-five thousand
12 undocumented immigrants in Hawaii, a population that has likely
13 increased since the 2005 study; and
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15 WHEREAS, between December 2007 and December 2008, an
16 estimated one hundred sixty-eight illegal undocumented workers
17 were arrested in Hawaii, of which sixty-one per cent were
18 working in the local construction industry, despite the fact
19 that thirty per cent of all unionized carpenters are unemployed
20 statewide; and
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22 WHEREAS, a 2006 estimate projected that the State spends
23 over \$9,000,000 each year in costs related to illegal or
24 undocumented aliens in Hawaii, including the costs for
25 education, emergency medical care, and incarceration; now,
26 therefore,
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28 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Twenty-fifth
29 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2009, the
30 House of Representatives concurring, that the following agencies
31 are requested to prepare and conduct a joint study to assess the

1 impact of illegal immigration on Hawaii's economy and public
2 resources:

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26 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Labor and
27 Industrial Relations is requested to serve as the lead agency
28 which, in consultation with all members of the joint study, is
29 requested to submit a report of the findings and recommendations
30 of the joint study, including any proposed legislation, to the
31 Legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of
32 the Regular Session of 2010; and

34 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the following agencies are
35 requested to form a task force to develop strategies for taking
36 immediate investigation and enforcement actions to prevent the
37 practice of hiring undocumented workers, recover funds owed to
38 the State by companies that are found to hire undocumented
39 workers, and prevent companies found to employ undocumented
40 workers from doing business in the State:

13 Industrial Relations is requested to serve as the lead agency
14 which, in consultation with all members of the task force, is
15 requested to submit a report of the findings and recommendations
16 of the task force, including any proposed legislation, to the
17 Legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of
18 the Regular Session of 2010; and

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20 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this
21 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Director of Labor
22 and Industrial Relations, Director of Taxation, Director of
23 Commerce and Consumer Affairs, Director of Health,
24 Superintendent of Education, Director of Public Safety,
25 Chairperson of the Board of Agriculture, the Executive Director
26 of the Hawaii Public Housing Authority, and the Director of
27 Human Services.
