
SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

DESIGNATING THE FIRST WEEK IN FEBRUARY AS HAWAII TEEN DATING
VIOLENCE AWARENESS AND PREVENTION WEEK.

- 1 WHEREAS, one in three female teenagers in a dating
2 relationship has feared for her physical safety when with a
3 partner; and
4
- 5 WHEREAS, one in two teenagers in a serious relationship
6 reports having compromised personal beliefs to please a partner;
7 and
8
- 9 WHEREAS, one in five teenagers in a serious relationship
10 reports having been hit, slapped, or pushed by a partner; and
11
- 12 WHEREAS, 27 percent of teenagers have been in dating
13 relationships in which their partners have called them names or
14 "put them down"; and
15
- 16 WHEREAS, 29 percent of girls who have been in a
17 relationship report having been pressured into engaging in
18 unwanted sex or sexual activities; and

- 20 WHEREAS, technologies such as cell phones and the Internet
21 have made dating abuse both more pervasive and more hidden; and

- 23 WHEREAS, 30 percent of teenagers who have been in a dating
24 relationship say they have been text-messaged between 10 and 30
25 times per hour by a partner seeking to determine their
26 whereabouts, activities, or whom they are with; and

- 28 WHEREAS, 72 percent of teenagers who reported that they had
29 been checked on by a boyfriend or girlfriend ten times or more
30 per hour by e-mail or text message did not tell their parents;

1 WHEREAS, parents are largely unaware of cell phone and
2 Internet harassment experienced by teenagers; and

4 WHEREAS, involvement in violent relationships during the
5 adolescent years can have serious ramifications for victims,
6 putting them at higher risk for substance abuse, eating
7 disorders, risky sexual behavior, suicide, and adult re-
8 victimization; and

10 WHEREAS, the severity of violence between intimate partners
11 has been found to be greater in cases in which a pattern of
12 violence has been established in adolescence; and

14 WHEREAS, the establishment of "Hawaii Teen Dating Violence
15 Awareness and Prevention Week" will benefit schools,
16 communities, and families regardless of socioeconomic status,
17 race, or sex; now, therefore,
18

19 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Twenty-fifth
20 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2009, the
21 House of Representatives concurring, that the first week in
22 February is hereby designated as "Hawaii Teen Dating Violence
23 Awareness and Prevention Week"; and

25 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Legislature call upon the
26 people of Hawaii, high schools, law enforcement personnel, state
27 and local officials, and interested groups to observe "Hawaii
28 Teen Dating Violence Awareness and Prevention Week" with
29 appropriate programs and activities that promote awareness and
30 encourage the prevention of teen dating violence in their
31 communities; and

33 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this
34 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Governor, Director
35 of Health, Superintendent of Education, President of the
36 University of Hawaii at Manoa, Attorney General, the mayor of
37 each county, and the Executive Director of the Hawaii State
38 Coalition Against Domestic Violence.
