SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE OFFICE OF HAWAIIAN AFFAIRS WITH THE ASSISTANCE OF
THE BERNICE PAUHI BISHOP MUSEUM TO DEVELOP A PLAN TO
IMPLEMENT REPLICAS OF HAWAIIAN HALE ON THE STATE CAPITOL
LAWN SURROUNDED BY TROPICAL FOLIAGE FOR REST AREAS.

1 WHEREAS, the State Capitol, with its unique architecture
2 and location, draws thousands of visitors and residents each
3 year as a place to discover the significance of the Capitol's
4 design as it relates to Hawaiian culture and to learn about
5 Hawaii's government as the only island-state in the nation; and

7 WHEREAS, preserving Hawaiian culture is vital to the
8 State's traditions and tourism industry, and replicas of
9 Hawaiian hale showcase the lifestyle of ancient Hawaiians; and

11 WHEREAS, the Capitol serves as a gathering place for people
12 to visit and serve as an open and inviting public facility; and

14 WHEREAS, utilizing the Capitol lawns to display Hawaiian
15 cultural structures such as replicas of Hawaiian hale surrounded
16 by aesthetic landscaping and foliage to provide sitting and rest
17 areas will bring more people to the Capitol, making it a true
18 gathering place; now, therefore,

20 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Twenty-fifth
21 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2009, the
22 House of Representatives concurring, that the Office of Hawaiian
23 Affairs with the assistance of the Bernice Pauahi Bishop Museum
24 is requested to develop a plan to implement replicas of Hawaiian
25 hale surrounded by appropriate tropical foliage to serve as rest
26 areas on the State Capitol lawn; and

28 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Office of Hawaiian Affairs
29 is requested to submit the plan to the Legislature twenty days
30 prior to the 2010 Regular Session; and

4 Board of Trustees of the Office of Hawaiian Affairs and the
