# SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF LAND AND NATURAL RESOURCES' NA ALA HELE PROGRAM TO DESIGNATE THE PI'ILANI TRAIL AS AN IMPORTANT HAWAIIAN COASTAL CULTURAL HERITAGE CORRIDOR.

1           WHEREAS, walking trails are an important part of Hawaii's  
2 natural resources, providing historic, recreational, and scenic  
3 value; and  
4

5           WHEREAS, stretching one hundred thirty-eight miles, the  
6 Alaloha trail on the island of Maui, also known as the King's  
7 Highway, is an ancient trail that encircled the island and  
8 connected villages and heiau scattered along the coastline; and  
9

10           WHEREAS, King Pi'ilani, a fourteenth century chief of east  
11 Maui and Hana districts, began the construction of the Alaloha  
12 trail, which was completed by his son; and  
13

14           WHEREAS, the Alaloha trail, also known as the Pi'ilani  
15 trail, is a culturally significant heritage corridor and is the  
16 only ancient highway to encircle the coastline of any of the  
17 Hawaiian islands; and

19           WHEREAS, recent efforts by the Hoaloha Aina in south Maui  
20 and Kapalua Resort in west Maui to restore this trail, and the  
21 efforts by Edna Farden Bekeart and the Patsy Mink Heritage Park  
22 to preserve the corridor need to be coordinated; now, therefore,

24           BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Twenty-fifth  
25 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2009, the  
26 House of Representatives concurring, that the Na Ala Hele  
27 program, under the Department of Land and Natural Resources, is  
28 requested to designate all public lands from Kaupo to Kapalua,  
29 along the Pi'ilani trail, as an important Hawaiian coastal  
30 cultural heritage corridor; and

1 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Na Ala Hele program is  
2 requested to coordinate a volunteer effort in conjunction with  
3 the Maui Coastal Land Trust and Tri-Isle Resource Conservation  
4 and Development Council that may include:

- 6 (1) An inventory of current mapping and a compilation of
- 7 completed studies;
- 8
- 9 (2) Incorporating current public and private partnerships,
- 10 including Hoaloha Aina and Maui Land and Pine;
- 11
- 12 (3) The opportunities of opening more of the trail for
- 13 public use, including obtaining input from private
- 14 landowners adjacent to the trail; and
- 15
- 16 (4) A general cost assessment to repair, acquire, and
- 17 maintain the trail for public use and designate it as
- 18 a national historic trail; and
- 19

20 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Na Ala Hele program is  
21 requested to submit a written report to the Legislature on its  
22 findings and recommendations twenty days prior to the convening  
23 of the 2010 Regular Session; and

25 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this  
26 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Chairperson of the  
27 Board of Land and Natural Resources, the Administrator of the Na  
28 Ala Hele program, the Mayor of Maui County, the Chairperson of  
29 the Maui County Council, the President of Maui Land and  
30 Pineapple, the Chairperson of the Board of Directors of the Tri-  
31 Isle Resource Conservation and Development Council, Chairperson  
32 of the Board of Directors of the Maui Coastal Land Trust, and  
33 the Founder of Hoaloha Aina.
