
A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PUBLIC SCHOOLS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that section 204 of
2 Public Law 108-265 requires participants in programs authorized
3 by the Richard B. Russell National School Lunch Act or the Child
4 Nutrition Act of 1966 to adopt wellness policies that include
5 nutrition guidelines for all food available on school campuses
6 during the school day. The purpose of the nutrition guidelines
7 is to promote student health and reduce childhood obesity. The
8 legislature finds that the State of Hawaii wellness guidelines
9 pursuant to Public Law 108-265 provide that schools neither
10 provide nor sell foods of minimal nutritional value, as
11 determined by the United States Department of Agriculture. The
12 legislature finds that most candy and some ice cream are of
13 minimal nutritional value and that the current exception for
14 candy and ice cream to the prohibition on the sale of
15 merchandise at public schools is therefore inconsistent with the
16 State of Hawaii wellness guidelines.



1 The purpose of this Act is to make it unlawful for the
2 department of education to operate stores or permit the sale of
3 ice cream, candy, and other merchandise on school campuses
4 without the written permission of the department, with certain
5 exceptions.

6 SECTION 2. Section 302A-1146, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
7 amended to read as follows:

8 "**§302A-1146 Schools; merchandise.** It shall be unlawful
9 for any public school, without the written permission of the
10 department, to operate stores or to sell or permit the sale of
11 merchandise~~[7]~~ on school campuses, with the ~~[following~~
12 ~~exceptions:]~~ exception of school lunches, milk, ~~[ice cream,~~
13 ~~candy,~~] and products made or grown at the school as part of the
14 educational program. ~~[The department, with the advice of the~~
15 ~~comptroller, shall adopt rules in conformance with chapter 91~~
16 ~~necessary for the purposes of this section.]"~~

17 SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
18 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

19 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
