SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION TO SET MORE STANDARDIZED
REQUIREMENTS FOR SENIOR PROJECTS.

1 WHEREAS, beginning with the graduating class of 2010,
2 students are required to complete a senior project in partial
3 fulfillment of the Board of Education Recognition Diploma, which
4 is a diploma offered to all public school students who elect to
5 complete more rigorous graduation requirements; and
6

7 WHEREAS, the senior project is a school-based initiative,
8 which means that the Department of Education sets certain
9 standardized guidelines but allows each individual school to set
10 its own detailed requirements for senior projects submitted to
11 that school; and
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13 WHEREAS, each senior project is composed of four elements -
14 a research paper, a culminating activity (a career focus,
15 service learning, or student personal interest project), a
16 project portfolio, and a presentation to a panel; and

18 WHEREAS, due to the flexibility provided by the Department
19 of Education to each school in implementing senior projects,
20 requirements for senior projects vary widely across schools in
21 the State despite some minimum guidelines set by the Department
22 of Education; and

24 WHEREAS, the "learning stretch" is one criterion used to
25 determine the quality of a senior project and can be subject to
26 differing interpretations based on the school a student attends
27 or the particular senior project panel reviewing the student
28 project; and

30 WHEREAS, some schools require the completion of one hundred
31 hours of community service, while other schools require the
32 completion of only forty hours of community service, towards the
33 culminating activity of the senior project; and



1 WHEREAS, a student who is pursuing a Board of Education
 2 Recognition Diploma and transfers to another high school in the
 3 State is responsible for meeting the senior project requirements
 4 of that student's new school, which may present a significant
 5 barrier to the completion of that student's senior project; and

7 WHEREAS, the flexibility granted to each individual school
 8 in setting requirements for senior projects creates unequal and
 9 inconsistent standards for attaining the Board of Education
 10 Recognition Diploma; now, therefore,
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12 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Twenty-fifth
 13 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2010, the
 14 House of Representatives concurring, that the Department of
 15 Education is requested to set more standardized criteria that
 16 shall apply to all public school students in the State who
 17 choose to pursue a Board of Education Recognition Diploma; and
 18

19 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the standardized criteria set
 20 by the Department of Education ensure a consistent quality of
 21 work required and fair grading of work required to attain the
 22 Board of Education Recognition Diploma; and
 23

24 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the standardized criteria set
 25 by the Department of Education include but not be limited to the
 26 following:
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- 28 (1) A standard number of hours required to fulfill the
 29 culminating activity; and
 30
- 31 (2) A standardized definition of the "learning stretch"
 32 that shall be applied uniformly across public schools
 33 statewide; and
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35 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this
 36 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Superintendent of
 37 Education and the Chairperson of the Board of Education.
