
A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HEALTH.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The purpose of this Act is to ensure that
2 Hawaii is consistent with the efforts of federal agencies to
3 control health care-associated infections. This Act also
4 ensures that the department of health has access to health
5 care-associated infection data reported by Hawaii's health care
6 providers to the federal government. In addition, this Act
7 requires each Centers for Disease Control and Prevention-
8 certified health care facilities in Hawaii to report certain
9 information regarding health care-associated infections.

10 SECTION 2. Chapter 321, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
11 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
12 and to read as follows:

13 "§321- Health care-associated infection reporting. (a)
14 Each health care facility in Hawaii that is certified by the
15 Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services shall report
16 information about health care-associated infections to the
17 Centers for Disease Control and Prevention's national healthcare



1 safety network, as specified in the rules of the Centers for
2 Medicare and Medicaid Services.

3 (b) Health care facilities subject to this section shall
4 authorize the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention to
5 allow the department to access health care-associated infection
6 data reported by those health care facilities to the national
7 healthcare safety network.

8 (c) The department may adopt rules pursuant to chapter 91
9 to require that health care-associated infections that are
10 multidrug-resistant be reported to the department through the
11 national healthcare safety network. The rules shall specify
12 which health care facilities are required to report those health
13 care-associated infections that are multidrug-resistant through
14 the national healthcare safety network, as well as the patient
15 populations that are to be targeted in the reports. The first
16 year of reporting required under this subsection shall be a
17 pilot test of the reporting system and shall not be reported or
18 disclosed to the public.

19 (d) The department shall preserve patient confidentiality
20 and shall not disclose to the public any patient-level data
21 obtained from any health care facility.



1 (e) The department may issue reports to the public about
2 health care-associated infections that aggregate data so that no
3 individual patient can be identified. The reports may identify
4 individual health care facilities. The reports shall use the
5 methodology or any part of the methodology developed by the
6 Centers for Disease Control and Prevention and the Centers for
7 Medicare and Medicaid Services for national reporting of health
8 care-associated infections.

9 (f) Health care-associated infection information held by
10 the department as a result of reporting under this section is
11 not subject to subpoena, discovery, or introduction into
12 evidence in any civil or criminal proceeding; provided that
13 health care-associated infection information otherwise available
14 from other sources shall not be immune from subpoena, discovery,
15 or introduction into evidence through those sources solely
16 because the information was provided as required by this
17 section.

18 (g) Beginning on June 30, 2013, and no later than June 30
19 of each year thereafter, the department shall prepare a public
20 report, in accordance with this section, containing information
21 pertaining to health care-associated infections in Hawaii for
22 the previous calendar year.



1 (h) For the purposes of this section:

2 "Department" means the department of health.

3 "Health care facility" means the same as in section
4 323D-2."

5 SECTION 3. The department of health shall submit a report
6 to the legislature providing an update on health care-associated
7 infection reporting required under section 2 of this Act no
8 later than twenty days prior to the convening of the regular
9 session of 2012.

10 SECTION 4. New statutory material is underscored.

11 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2051.
