# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY.

**BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:**

1 SECTION 1. Section 27-43, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is  
2 amended by amending subsection (b) to read as follows:

3 "(b) There is established an information technology  
4 steering committee to assist the chief information officer in  
5 developing the State's information technology standards and  
6 policies, including but not limited to:

7 (1) Assisting the chief information officer in developing  
8 and implementing the state information technology  
9 strategic plans;

10 (2) Assessing executive branch departments' progress in  
11 meeting the objectives defined in the state  
12 information technology strategic plans and identifying  
13 best practices for shared or consolidated services;

14 (3) Ensuring technology projects are selected based on  
15 their potential impact and risk to the State, as well  
16 as their strategic value;



1 (4) Ensuring that executive branch departments maintain  
2 sufficient tools to assess the value and benefits of  
3 technology initiatives;

4 (5) Assisting the chief information officer in developing  
5 state information technology standards and policies;  
6 and

7 (6) Clarifying the roles, responsibilities, and authority  
8 of the information and communication services  
9 division, specifically as it relates to its statewide  
10 duties.

11 The ~~[members of the]~~ information technology steering  
12 committee shall consist of eleven members, with four members to  
13 be [appointed in equal number] appointed by the senate president  
14 ~~[and]~~, four members to be appointed by the speaker of the house  
15 of representatives, [respectively,] one member to be appointed  
16 by the chief justice, and one member to be appointed by the  
17 governor, and shall include representatives from executive  
18 branch departments, including large user agencies such as the  
19 department of education and the University of Hawaii; the  
20 judiciary; the legislature; and private individuals. The chief  
21 information officer shall serve as the chair of the committee  
22 and shall ensure that the committee is evaluated periodically."



1           SECTION 2. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed  
2 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.  
3           SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.



**Report Title:**

Information Technology Steering Committee; Members

**Description:**

Clarifies that the information technology steering committee shall consist of eleven members: four members to be appointed by the senate president, four members to be appointed by the speaker of the house of representatives, one member to be appointed by the chief justice, and one member to be appointed by the governor, with the chief information officer to serve as the chair.
