
A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO ELECTRIC VEHICLES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Act 290, Session Laws of Hawaii 1997,
2 established incentives for registration, licensing, parking, and
3 operation of electric vehicles. Although the provisions
4 relating to vehicle licensing and parking are valid laws of
5 Hawaii, it is difficult to find and reference them, because they
6 are only contained in the session laws, which are not as readily
7 available to the public as are the Hawaii Revised Statutes,
8 which are available online.

9 The purpose of this Act is to enable the public to more
10 readily access the existing laws pertaining to electric vehicles
11 by codifying elements of Act 290, Session Laws of Hawaii 1997,
12 into the Hawaii Revised Statutes and providing amendments for
13 clarity, consistency, and enforceability.

14 SECTION 2. Chapter 286, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
15 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
16 and to read as follows:

17 "§286- Electric vehicles; registration; license plates;
18 parking fee exemptions. (a) The department of transportation



1 may adopt rules pursuant to chapter 91 for the registration of,
2 and issuance of special license plates for, electric vehicles.

3 (b) An electric vehicle on which an electric vehicle
4 license plate is affixed shall be exempt from payment of parking
5 fees, including those collected through parking meters, charged
6 by any state or county authority in this State, except that this
7 exemption shall not apply:

8 (1) While the vehicle is parked at an electric vehicle
9 charging station;

10 (2) For more than two and one half hours of metered
11 parking, or the maximum amount of time the meter
12 allows, whichever is longer; or

13 (3) To parking fees assessed in increments longer than one
14 twenty-four-hour day, including weekly, monthly, or
15 annual parking permits.

16 (c) An electric vehicle on which an electric vehicle
17 license plate is affixed shall be exempt from high occupancy
18 vehicle lane restrictions.

19 (d) For the purposes of this section:

20 "Electric vehicle" means:

21 (1) A neighborhood electric vehicle; or



1 (2) A vehicle, with four or more wheels, that draws
2 propulsion energy from a battery with at least five
3 kilowatt hours of energy storage capacity that can be
4 recharged from an external source of electricity.

5 "Electric vehicle charging system" means a system that:

6 (1) Is capable of providing electricity from a non-vehicle
7 source to charge the batteries of one or more electric
8 vehicles;

9 (2) Meets recognized standards, including standard SAE
10 J1772 of SAE International; and

11 (3) Is designed and installed in compliance with article
12 625 of the National Electrical Code."

13 SECTION 3. Act 290, Session Laws of Hawaii 1997, is
14 repealed.

15 SECTION 4. New statutory material is underscored.

16 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on January 1, 2013,
17 and shall be repealed on December 31, 2019.

Codifies with modifications Act 290, Session Laws of Hawaii 1997, for the registration of, and issuance of license plates for, electric vehicles, and the exemptions from parking fees and high occupancy vehicle lane restrictions. Allows the Department of Transportation to adopt rules for the registration of, and issuance of license plates for, electric vehicles. Effective January 1, 2013, and repealed on December 31, 2019.
