
HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING HAWAII'S CONGRESSIONAL DELEGATION TO SUPPORT THE
EFFORTS OF THE NATIONAL WOMEN'S HISTORY MUSEUM TO SECURE A
PERMANENT HOME IN THE NATION'S CAPITAL.

1 WHEREAS, in 1987, the United States Congress declared March
2 as "Women's History Month" to acknowledge the important role
3 women have played in shaping America; and
4

5 WHEREAS, although women constitute a majority of the
6 nation's population, their achievements and contributions are
7 underrepresented in museums and memorials; and
8

9 WHEREAS, only ten percent of the people identified in a
10 recent survey of eighteen history textbooks were women; and
11

12 WHEREAS, in 1999, The President's Commission on the
13 Celebration of Women in American History called for a women's
14 history museum to be established on the National Mall in
15 Washington, D.C.; and
16

17 WHEREAS, the National Women's History Museum, founded in
18 1996, is a nonpartisan, nonprofit, educational institution
19 dedicated to preserving, interpreting, and celebrating the
20 diverse historic contributions of women, and integrating the
21 heritage of women fully into this nation's history; and
22

23 WHEREAS, the National Women's History Museum seeks a site
24 on or close to the National Mall and in close proximity to the
25 White House and United States Capitol Building; and
26

27 WHEREAS, the National Women's History Museum has identified
28 federally owned property for sale near the National Mall; and
29

30 WHEREAS, legislation is currently pending in the United
31 States Congress seeking authorization for the National Women's



1 History Museum to purchase this property at fair market value
2 with privately raised funds; and
3

4 WHEREAS, no federal funds are being requested for the
5 purchase of this property; and
6

7 WHEREAS, there are museums dedicated to flight, postage
8 stamps, buildings, and many other important issues and people of
9 interest, but there is not a museum dedicated solely to women,
10 who comprise fifty-one percent of the nation's population; and
11

12 WHEREAS, the National Women's History Museum will showcase
13 the full history of women in the United States and the
14 contributions they have made and continue to make in the
15 marketplace, arts and sciences, government, entertainment,
16 education, home, and community; and
17

18 WHEREAS, a coalition of forty-three women's organizations
19 representing 8 million women, which includes the National
20 Foundation for Women Legislators, Inc., supports the efforts of
21 the National Women's History Museum to establish a permanent
22 residence near the National Mall, the most prominent location
23 for museums to be situated in the nation's capital; now,
24 therefore,

26 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the
27 Twenty-sixth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session
28 of 2012, the Senate concurring, that Hawaii's Congressional
29 delegation is requested to support the efforts of the National
30 Women's History Museum to secure a permanent home in the
31 nation's capital for a museum that will highlight the important
32 role women have played in shaping this great nation; and

34 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this
35 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to Hawaii's Congressional
36 delegation, the President and Chief Executive Officer of the
37 National Women's History Museum, and the President and Chief
38 Executive Officer of the National Foundation for Women
39 Legislators, Inc.
