
SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

URGING THE STATE TO EXPAND THE SCOPE OF THE COMPREHENSIVE
INFORMATION SYSTEM ESTABLISHED PURSUANT TO ACT 54, SESSION
LAWS OF HAWAII 2011, TO FURTHER INCLUDE PUBLIC FACILITIES,
THEREBY CREATING A COMPREHENSIVE ASSET MANAGEMENT SYSTEM
FOR PUBLIC LANDS AND PUBLIC FACILITIES.

1 WHEREAS, Act 54, Session Laws of Hawaii 2011, establishes a
2 comprehensive information system for public lands to be used for
3 the inventory and maintenance of information relating to the
4 public land trust, also known as ceded lands, and other state
5 lands; and

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7 WHEREAS, the land inventory required to be taken and
8 information to be maintained will be important tools to assist
9 the State to manage its public lands; and

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11 WHEREAS, all state agencies are directed to assist the
12 Department of Land and Natural Resources in facilitating the
13 establishment of the comprehensive information system for public
14 lands; and

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16 WHEREAS, the Department of Land and Natural Resources shall
17 also determine what other information would be useful to include
18 in the inventory; and

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20 WHEREAS, the Department of Accounting and General Services
21 is responsible for managing and supervising a wide range of
22 state programs and activities including:

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24 (1) Maintenance and repair of state buildings and
25 facilities through its Central Services Division; and
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27 (2) Comprehensively managing the information processing
28 and telecommunication systems in order to provide
29 services to all state agencies through its Information
30 and Communication Services Division; and



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2 WHEREAS, insufficient information on underutilized land and
3 public facilities is exacerbating a loss of revenues because
4 inventories and necessary data required are not centralized and
5 accessible to all decision makers in order to make sound
6 economic decisions; and

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8 WHEREAS, a comprehensive information system that is a
9 centralized database which can be accessed by all state
10 authorized users to ensure accurate and consistent utilization
11 of state lands and public facilities in the best economically
12 responsible manner is necessary; and

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14 WHEREAS, given the dire economic situation of the State, it
15 is important that all state agencies work together to ensure
16 that our lands and facilities are being used to their fullest
17 potential; now, therefore,

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19 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Twenty-sixth
20 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2012, the
21 House of Representatives concurring, that the Department of Land
22 and Natural Resources is urged to expand the scope of the
23 comprehensive information system established pursuant to Act 54,
24 Session Laws of Hawaii 2011, to inventory and maintain
25 information about the lands of the public land trust described
26 in section 5(f) of the Admission Act and article XII, section 4,
27 of the Hawaii State Constitution to further include public
28 facilities, thereby creating a comprehensive asset management
29 system for public lands and facilities; and

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31 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Land and
32 Natural Resources utilize the resources of the Department of
33 Accounting and General Services to coordinate and develop the
34 comprehensive asset management system; and

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36 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this
37 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Chairperson of the
38 Board of Land and Natural Resources and State Comptroller.
