SENATE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE BOARD OF EDUCATION AND STATE LIBRARIAN TO DEVELOP
A STRATEGIC PLAN TO OPTIMIZE THE USE OF STATE PUBLIC
LIBRARY FACILITIES.

1 WHEREAS, a strong public library system contributes to the
2 economic, educational, and cultural vitality of the State; and
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4 WHEREAS, to ensure vital resources are accessible and
5 available when people need them, the Hawaii State Public Library
6 System needs to explore the possibility of creating additional
7 sources of funding to help support its ongoing operations; and
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9 WHEREAS, there are fifty branches in the Hawaii State
10 Public Library System; and
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12 WHEREAS, while the Hawaii State Public Library System hosts
13 programs such as preschool storytimes, storytelling events,
14 author talks, and informational seminars at its facilities,
15 there is the potential to further maximize the use of library
16 facilities; and
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18 WHEREAS, allowing for greater and more diversified types of
19 uses of library facilities may provide the Hawaii State Public
20 Library System with additional sources of funding; now,
21 therefore,
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23 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Twenty-sixth
24 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2012,
25 that the Board of Education and State Librarian are requested to
26 develop a strategic plan to optimize the use of state public
27 library facilities; and
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29 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that in creating a strategic plan,
30 the Board of Education and State Librarian are requested to:
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- 32 (1) Examine the potential to use state public library
33 facilities for entrepreneurial purposes and any other
34 uses that can generate funds to support the Hawaii
35 State Public Library System;





- 3 by other state agencies and programs; and
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- 5 (3) Consider the feasibility of having all library
- 6 branches be open to the public on Saturdays; and
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8 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Board of Education and
9 State Librarian report their findings and recommendations,
10 including any proposed legislation, to the Legislature no later
11 than twenty days prior to the convening of the Regular Session
12 of 2013; and

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14 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this
15 Resolution be transmitted to the Chairperson of the Board of
16 Education, State Librarian, Superintendent of Education, and
17 Comptroller.
