Chairs Coffman and Souki, Vice Chairs Kawakami and Ichiyama, and Members of the  
Committees.

The Department of Business, Economic Development, and Tourism (DBEDT) offers  
comments on House Concurrent Resolution (HCR 201) and House Resolution (HR 155).

DBEDT recognizes the challenges involved in gaining private sector investment in the  
build-out of an Electric Vehicle (EV) infrastructure. The State of Hawaii has invested  
approximately \$5 million in Federal ARRA funding to install a network of more than 200  
publicly accessible EV charging stations on private and public parking lots to encourage more  
EV purchases and private sector investment.

It would be helpful to assess the viability of new financing mechanisms or other subsidies to help private parking lot owners to defray the costs associated with installing charging equipment, however, HCR 201 and HR 155 do not identify any resources to conduct this study. It would be difficult for DBEDT to allocate resources to conduct the analysis and produce a report without degrading existing programs.

Committee Chairs Coffman and Souki; Vice Chairs Kawakami and Ichiyama; and Committee Members:

The County of Kaua'i supports HCR201/HR 155 which requests the Department of Business, Economic Development and Tourism to determine financing mechanisms to assist private parking lot owners with the costs associated with providing parking stalls and charging units for electric vehicles.

The County has first-hand knowledge of how expensive charger installations can be. The County has installed 10 charging stations at county locations at a total cost of \$172,633 which averages out to \$17,263 per stall. The costs were even higher but we managed to lower costs by re-locating chargers from expensive locations that included a lot of concrete and asphalt cutting to alternate locations with less construction costs. We did not have options for cheaper overhead power lines versus underground service. Many businesses and parking lot owners will also not have many options to re-locate charging stations. The County supports the State's efforts to establish electric vehicle infrastructure statewide but we also recognize the added cost to the businesses and parking lot owners to comply with Act 156 Session Laws of Hawaii 2009. These small businesses want to comply but need some financial assistance. We support any efforts for alternative financing mechanism to help establish electric vehicle infrastructure in private parking lots.

We support approval of this resolution.
