

JUSTIFICATION SHEET

DEPARTMENT: Land and Natural Resources

TITLE: A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO THE HAWAIIAN ISLANDS HUMPBACK WHALE NATIONAL MARINE SANCTUARY.

PURPOSE: To recognize the State's role in co-managing the Hawaiian Islands Humpback Whale National Marine Sanctuary (Sanctuary) in the Hawaii Revised Statutes (HRS).

MEANS: Add a new chapter to the HRS.

JUSTIFICATION: The Sanctuary, since 1998, has been co-managed by the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA) and the State of Hawaii (State) by way of the "Compact Agreement for Coordinated Management of Hawaiian Islands Humpback Whale National Marine Sanctuary" signed May 4, 1998. The State accepted the Sanctuary in state waters and entered into the co-management agreement with NOAA to improve interagency coordination and enhance the management of Hawaii's humpback whales and other marine resources. When this co-management arrangement was entered into, the State did not give up any jurisdiction, authority, or responsibility to manage state lands and resources within sanctuary boundaries. However, the Sanctuary and the State's co-management program, has never been formally established under state law.

This bill seeks to ensure the State's commitment to co-management over the long-term, which promotes and protects state interests and enhances the management of our unique marine resources.

Impact on the public: The general public would benefit from the State's commitment to co-manage the Sanctuary's resources into perpetuity.
