
A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO COLLECTIVE BARGAINING.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Section 89-6, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2 amended by amending subsection (d) to read as follows:

3 "(d) For the purpose of negotiating a collective
4 bargaining agreement, the public employer of an appropriate
5 bargaining unit shall mean the governor together with the
6 following employers:

7 (1) For bargaining units (1), (2), (3), (4), [~~(9)~~] (10),
8 (13), and (14), the governor shall have six votes and
9 the mayors, the chief justice, and the Hawaii health
10 systems corporation board shall each have one vote if
11 they have employees in the particular bargaining unit;

12 (2) For bargaining units (11) and (12), the governor shall
13 have four votes and the mayors shall each have one
14 vote;

15 (3) For bargaining units (5) and (6), the governor shall
16 have three votes, the board of education shall have
17 two votes, and the superintendent of education shall
18 have one vote; [~~and~~]



1 (4) For bargaining units (7) and (8), the governor shall
2 have three votes, the board of regents of the
3 University of Hawaii shall have two votes, and the
4 president of the University of Hawaii shall have one
5 vote[-]; and

6 (5) For bargaining unit (9), the governor shall have three
7 votes, the Hawaii health systems corporation board
8 shall have two votes, and the chief justice shall have
9 one vote.

10 Any decision to be reached by the applicable employer group
11 shall be on the basis of simple majority, except when a
12 bargaining unit includes county employees from more than one
13 county. In that case, the simple majority shall include at
14 least one county."

15 SECTION 2. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
16 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

17 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on February 5, 2060.
