
A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO INTOXICATING LIQUOR.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Section 281-31, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2 amended as follows:

3 1. By amending subsection (c) to read:

4 "(c) Class 2. Restaurant license.

5 (1) A license under this class shall authorize the
6 licensee to sell liquor specified in this subsection
7 for consumption on the premises; provided that a
8 restaurant licensee, with commission approval, may
9 provide off-premises catering of food and liquor;
10 provided further that the catering activity shall be
11 directly related to the licensee's operation as a
12 restaurant. A license under this class shall also
13 authorize the licensee to sell beer, malt beverages,
14 wine, or cider for off-premises consumption; provided
15 that the beer, malt beverage, wine, or cider is sold
16 in a securely sealed or covered glass, ceramic, or
17 metal container that is sold to or provided by the



1 patron, and each sealed or covered glass, ceramic, or
2 metal container does not exceed a maximum capacity of
3 one-half gallon. A licensee under this class shall be
4 issued a license according to the category of
5 establishment the licensee owns or operates. The
6 categories of establishment shall be as follows:

- 7 (A) A standard bar; or
- 8 (B) Premises in which live entertainment or recorded
9 music is provided. Facilities for dancing by the
10 patrons may be permitted as provided by
11 commission rules.

12 (2) If a licensee under class 2 desires to change the
13 category of establishment the licensee owns or
14 operates, the licensee shall apply for a new license
15 applicable to the category of the licensee's
16 establishment.

- 17 (3) Of this class, there shall be the following kinds:
- 18 (A) General (includes all liquor except alcohol);
 - 19 (B) Beer and wine; and
 - 20 (C) Beer.



1 Notwithstanding section 281-57, the commission may approve at
2 one public hearing and without notice the change to a class 2
3 restaurant license of a licensee holding a class 5 dispenser
4 license who meets the requirements of a class 2 license."

5 2. By amending subsection (e) to read:

6 "(e) Class 4. Retail dealer license. A license to sell
7 liquor at retail or to class 10 licensees shall authorize the
8 licensee to sell the liquor therein specified in their original
9 packages. A license under this class shall also authorize the
10 licensee to sell beer, malt beverages, wine, or cider for off-
11 premises consumption; provided that the beer, malt beverage,
12 wine, or cider is sold in a securely sealed or covered glass,
13 ceramic, or metal container that is sold to or provided by the
14 patron, and each sealed or covered glass, ceramic, or metal
15 container does not exceed a maximum capacity of one half-gallon.

16 Under a class 4 license, no liquor shall be consumed on the
17 premises except as authorized by the commission. Of this class,
18 there shall be the following kinds:

- 19 (1) General (includes all liquor except alcohol);
- 20 (2) Beer and wine; and
- 21 (3) Alcohol."



- 1 3. By amending subsection (n) to read:
- 2 "(n) Class 14. Brewpub license. A brewpub licensee:
- 3 (1) May sell malt beverages manufactured on the licensee's
- 4 premises for consumption on the premises;
- 5 (2) May sell malt beverages manufactured by the licensee
- 6 in brewery-sealed packages to class 3 wholesale dealer
- 7 licensees pursuant to conditions imposed by the county
- 8 by ordinance or rule;
- 9 (3) May sell intoxicating liquor purchased from a class 3
- 10 wholesale dealer licensee to consumers for consumption
- 11 on the licensee's premises. The categories of
- 12 establishments shall be as follows:
- 13 (A) A standard bar; or
- 14 (B) Premises in which live entertainment or recorded
- 15 music is provided. Facilities for dancing by the
- 16 patrons may be permitted as provided by
- 17 commission rules;
- 18 (4) May, subject to federal labeling and bottling
- 19 requirements, sell malt beverages manufactured on the
- 20 licensee's premises to consumers in brewery-sealed
- 21 kegs and sell malt beverages manufactured on the



1 licensee's premises or purchased from a class 1
2 manufacturer licensee, a class 3 wholesale dealer
3 licensee, a class 14 brewpub licensee, or a class 18
4 small craft producer pub licensee to consumers in
5 growlers for off-premises consumption; provided that
6 for purposes of this paragraph, "growler" means a
7 glass, ceramic, or metal container, not to exceed one
8 half-gallon, which shall be securely sealed;

9 (5) May, subject to federal labeling and bottling
10 requirements, sell malt beverages manufactured on the
11 licensee's premises in recyclable containers provided
12 by the licensee or by the consumer which do not exceed
13 one gallon per container and are securely sealed on
14 the licensee's premises to consumers for off-premises
15 consumption;

16 (6) Shall comply with all regulations pertaining to class
17 4 retail dealer licensees when engaging in the retail
18 sale of malt beverages;

19 (7) May, subject to federal labeling and bottling
20 requirements, sell malt beverages manufactured on the
21 licensee's premises in brewery-sealed containers



1 directly to class 2 restaurant licensees, class 3
2 wholesale dealer licensees, class 4 retail dealer
3 licensees, class 5 dispenser licensees, class 6 club
4 licensees, class 8 transient vessel licensees, class 9
5 tour or cruise vessel licensees, class 10 special
6 licensees, class 11 cabaret licensees, class 12 hotel
7 licensees, class 13 caterer licensees, class 14
8 brewpub licensees, class 15 condominium hotel
9 licensees, class 18 small craft producer pub
10 licensees, and consumers pursuant to conditions
11 imposed by county regulations governing class 1
12 manufacturer licensees and class 3 wholesale dealer
13 licensees; and

14 (8) May conduct the activities under paragraphs (1) to (7)
15 at one location other than the licensee's premises;
16 provided that:

17 (A) The manufacturing takes place in Hawaii; and

18 (B) The other location is properly licensed under the
19 same ownership."

20 4. By amending subsection (r) to read:



1 "(r) Class 18. Small craft producer pub license. A small
2 craft producer pub licensee:

3 (1) Shall manufacture not more than:

4 (A) Sixty thousand barrels of malt beverages;

5 (B) Twenty thousand barrels of wine; or

6 (C) Seven thousand five hundred barrels of alcohol on
7 the licensee's premises during the license year;

8 provided that for purposes of this paragraph, "barrel"
9 means a container not exceeding thirty-one gallons or
10 wine gallons of liquor;

11 (2) May sell malt beverages, wine, or alcohol manufactured
12 on the licensee's premises for consumption on the
13 premises;

14 (3) May sell malt beverages, wine, or alcohol manufactured
15 by the licensee in producer-sealed packages to class 3
16 wholesale dealer licensees pursuant to conditions
17 imposed by the county by ordinance or rule;

18 (4) May sell intoxicating liquor purchased from a class 3
19 wholesale dealer licensee to consumers for consumption
20 on the licensee's premises. The categories of
21 establishments shall be as follows:



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- 1 (A) A standard bar; or
- 2 (B) Premises in which live entertainment or recorded
- 3 music is provided. Facilities for dancing by the
- 4 patrons may be permitted as provided by
- 5 commission rules;
- 6 (5) May, subject to federal labeling and bottling
- 7 requirements, sell malt beverages manufactured on the
- 8 licensee's premises to consumers in producer-sealed
- 9 kegs and sell malt beverages manufactured on the
- 10 licensee's premises or purchased from a class 1
- 11 manufacturer licensee, a class 3 wholesale dealer
- 12 licensee, a class 14 brewpub licensee, or a class 18
- 13 small craft producer pub licensee to consumers in
- 14 growlers for off-premises consumption; provided that
- 15 for purposes of this paragraph, "growler" means a
- 16 glass, ceramic, or metal container, not to exceed one
- 17 half-gallon, which shall be securely sealed;
- 18 (6) May, subject to federal labeling and bottling
- 19 requirements, sell malt beverages, wine, or alcohol
- 20 manufactured on the licensee's premises in recyclable

1 containers provided by the licensee or by the consumer
2 which do not exceed:

3 (A) One gallon per container for malt beverages and
4 wine; and

5 (B) One liter for alcohol; and
6 are securely sealed on the licensee's premises to
7 consumers for off-premises consumption;

8 (7) Shall comply with all regulations pertaining to class
9 4 retail dealer licensees when engaging in the retail
10 sale of malt beverages, wine, and alcohol;

11 (8) May, subject to federal labeling and bottling
12 requirements, sell malt beverages, wine, and alcohol
13 manufactured on the licensee's premises in producer-
14 sealed containers directly to class 2 restaurant
15 licensees, class 3 wholesale dealer licensees, class 4
16 retail dealer licensees, class 5 dispenser licensees,
17 class 6 club licensees, class 8 transient vessel
18 licensees, class 9 tour or cruise vessel licensees,
19 class 10 special licensees, class 11 cabaret
20 licensees, class 12 hotel licensees, class 13 caterer
21 licensees, class 14 brewpub licensees, class 15



1 condominium hotel licensees, class 18 small craft
 2 producer pub licensees, and consumers pursuant to
 3 conditions imposed by county regulations governing
 4 class 1 manufacturer licensees and class 3 wholesale
 5 dealer licensees; and

6 (9) May conduct the activities under paragraphs (1) to (8)
 7 at one location other than the licensee's premises;
 8 provided that:

9 (A) The manufacturing takes place in Hawaii; and

10 (B) The other location is properly licensed under the
 11 same ownership."

12 SECTION 2. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
 13 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
 14 begun before its effective date.

15 SECTION 3. New statutory material is underscored.

16 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.

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Report Title:

Liquor Licenses; Restaurant; Retail Dealer; Brewpub; Small Craft Producer Pub

Description:

Authorizes restaurants and retail dealers with a liquor license to sell beer, malt beverages, wine, or cider for off-premises consumption, under certain conditions. Authorizes brewpubs and small craft producer pubs with a liquor license to sell for off-premises consumption malt beverages purchased from another liquor licensee.

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
