
HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE LEGISLATIVE REFERENCE BUREAU TO EXAMINE IF AND
HOW OTHER STATES REGULATE TOUR OPERATORS WITHIN THEIR
JURISDICTION.

1 WHEREAS, tourism, which accounted for twenty one percent of
2 the state economy in 2013, is the largest single contributor to
3 Hawaii's gross domestic product; and

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5 WHEREAS, it is in the best interest of the State to ensure
6 the safety of all residents and visitors; and

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8 WHEREAS, Hawaii currently does not regulate the activities
9 of tour and excursion groups soliciting residents or visitors;
10 and

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12 WHEREAS, there has been a rise in tour activity in state
13 parks despite the closure of Sacred Falls State Park in 1999 due
14 to a rockslide and resulting deaths; and

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16 WHEREAS, in December 2014, two tour guides were charged for
17 prohibited entry into closed areas within the Wao Kele O Puna
18 Forest Reserve and the Kahaualea Natural Area Reserve and for
19 engaging in illegal commercial activities on state-managed
20 lands, including leading so-called "lava tours"; and

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22 WHEREAS, in February 2015, another tour guide was charged
23 with trespassing, reckless endangering, and conducting illegal
24 commercial activities in a natural area reserve for leading a
25 "lava tour" group in the Kahaualea Natural Area Reserve in
26 Paho-a-Puna; and

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28 WHEREAS, the Department of Land and Natural Resources
29 imposes a fine of up to \$5,000 for a first offense of entry into
30 closed public lands; now, therefore,



1 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the
 2 Twenty-eighth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular
 3 Session of 2015, the Senate concurring, that the Legislative
 4 Reference Bureau is requested to examine if and how other states
 5 regulate tour operators within their jurisdiction; and







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 7 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the examination include a

 14 Legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of

 18 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Director of the
 19 Legislative Reference Bureau.
