## HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

STRONGLY URGING THE UNITED STATES DEPARTMENT OF THE INTERIOR AND THE UNITED STATES CONGRESS TO PROVIDE ADDITIONAL FEDERAL AID TO AND REIMBURSE THE STATE OF HAWAII FOR EXPENSES RELATING TO HEALTH CARE ASSISTANCE SERVICES PROVIDED TO MIGRANTS UNDER THE COMPACT OF FREE ASSOCIATION.

WHEREAS, the Federated States of Micronesia, the Republic of the Marshall Islands, and the Republic of Palau, entered into an agreement with the government of the United States known as the Compact of Free Association (Compact); and

WHEREAS, the Compact allows migrants from the Federated States of Micronesia, the Republic of the Marshall Islands, and the Republic of Palau, to freely immigrate to the United States; and

WHEREAS, when the Compact was first agreed to, migrants had access to federally-funded medical assistance; and

WHEREAS, the Personal Responsibility and Work Opportunities Reconciliation Act of 1996 prevents migrants from Compact nations from receiving federally-funded medical assistance; and

WHEREAS, since the enactment of the Personal Responsibility and Work Opportunities Reconciliation Act of 1996, the State of Hawaii has continued to offer migrants from Compact nations medical assistance through a variety of state-funded programs; and

WHEREAS, it is in the spirit of aloha that the State of Hawaii has and will continue to provide medical assistance to Compact migrants, despite the Ninth Circuit Court of Appeals ruling that the State has "no constitutional obligation to fill

the gap left by Congress's withdrawal of federal funding for [Compact] residents"; and

WHEREAS, in state fiscal year 2012-2013 alone, the State of Hawaii Department of Human Services spent \$47,600,000 on citizens from Compact nations; and

WHEREAS, the federal government must address the issue of additional federal support for the State to continue providing state services arising from the unique federally created relationship the United States has with the Compact of Free Association nations; now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the Twenty-eighth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2015, the Senate concurring, that the Congress of the United States and the United States Department of the Interior are strongly urged to provide additional federal aid to and reimburse the State of Hawaii for expenses relating to health care assistance to migrants from Compact of Free Association nations; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Office of Insular Affairs of the United States Department of the Interior is strongly urged to review the funding of the Compact Impact Assistance grant and to make every effort to increase the amount of direct assistance available to the State of Hawaii to offset costs incurred by the State; and

 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the United States Congress is strongly urged to support federal legislation to amend the Personal Responsibility and Work Opportunity Reconciliation Act of 1996 to render Compact of Free Association migrants eligible to receive federally funded financial and medical assistance; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the President of the United States, the Majority Leader of the United States Senate, the Speaker of the United States House of Representatives, the members of Hawaii's congressional delegation, the United States Secretary of the Interior, the Director of the Office of Insular
