
A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO IDENTIFICATION CARDS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Section 286-304, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2 amended to read as follows:
3 " ~~[+] §286-304 [±]~~ Procedure. (a) All information required
4 by section 286-303 shall be obtained by employees of the
5 examiner of drivers as provided for by rules of the director and
6 by individual interviews with the applicant for the
7 identification card or parent, individual in loco parentis, or
8 guardian, as shown by letters of guardianship. Every applicant
9 or individual providing information on behalf of any applicant
10 under part VI and this part shall answer truthfully all
11 questions, furnish all information within the possession or
12 knowledge of the individual that may be asked or required by the
13 employee within the scope of the requirements of this part, and
14 submit to the examiner of drivers all information and supporting
15 documentation required by rules of the director.
16 (b) Special provisions may be made by rules adopted by the
17 director.



1 (c) The examiner of drivers may require an applicant, or
2 any individual providing information on behalf of an applicant,
3 to furnish original or certified copies of documents to
4 establish or corroborate the information required to establish
5 identity under this part and may, by rules, set forth what
6 documents will be required to support or corroborate certain
7 information.

8 (d) For a person who qualifies as homeless pursuant to
9 section 346-361, the examiner of drivers may accept a signed
10 sworn statement from a member of a victim services organization,
11 an attorney, a member of the clergy, correctional institution
12 staff, or a medical or other health professional from whom the
13 person has sought services as documentary evidence of the
14 person's address."

15 SECTION 2. (a) There is established a working group to be
16 placed in the department of human services for administrative
17 purposes, which shall conduct research and develop a plan to
18 enable individuals in the State, who are unable to produce
19 proper identification, to obtain identification certification.

20 (b) The following individuals shall serve as members of
21 the working group:



- 1 (1) The director of human services or the director's
2 designee;
- 3 (2) The director of health or the director's designee;
- 4 (3) The director of transportation or the director's
5 designee; and
- 6 (4) An individual who shall represent nonprofit
7 organizations.
- 8 (c) Members of the working group shall serve without
9 compensation and without reimbursement for expenses.
- 10 (d) No member shall be made subject to chapter 84, Hawaii
11 Revised Statutes, solely because of that member's participation
12 as a member of the working group.
- 13 (e) The working group shall submit an interim report to
14 the legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening
15 of the regular session of 2016.
- 16 (f) The working group shall submit a final report with its
17 findings and recommendations, including any proposed
18 legislation, to the legislature no later than twenty days prior
19 to the convening of the regular session of 2017.
- 20 (g) The working group shall be dissolved on June 30, 2017.



1 SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
2 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

3 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on January 7, 2059.



Report Title:

Identification Cards; Examiner of Drivers; Homeless; Sworn Statement

Description:

Allows the examiner of drivers to accept a sworn statement from a victim services organization, an attorney, a member of the clergy, correctional institution staff, or a medical or health professional as documentary evidence of a homeless person's address. Establishes a working group to enable homeless individuals in the State to obtain identification certification. (SB273 HD1)

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
