A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE INTERIM ASSISTANCE REIMBURSEMENT SPECIAL FUND.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. An eligibility determination for federal 2 supplemental security income can take several months or years if 3 an appeal is filed. At one time, the average length of time for 4 an initial supplemental security income determination was three to five months. Presently, the average length of time has grown 5 to four to eight months. Consequently, in a majority of cases, 6 the federal interim assistance reimbursement is not received by 7 8 the department of human services in the same fiscal year in 9 which the state-funded benefits were paid. The department of human services is not allowed to retain 10

interim assistance reimbursements received for a prior fiscal year, and instead is required to deposit these reimbursements into the general fund. The department of human services returned \$1,056,219 to the general fund in 2013 and \$897,335 to the general fund in 2012. The department of human services would not have needed emergency appropriations in 2012 for the general assistance program if the department had been able to retain the \$897,335 that had lapsed to the general fund.

- 1 Shortfalls also affect benefit payments. The department of 2 human services did not ask for emergency appropriations in 2013 3 and chose to keep the general assistance payment at \$298 per 4 month, with a small increase to \$319 in October of 2013 after a 5 slight caseload decrease. However, the department of human 6 services would have been able to increase the general assistance 7 payment amount earlier and in a higher amount had it been able 8 to retain the interim assistance reimbursements from prior 9 fiscal years. 10 The purpose of this Act is to establish the interim 11 assistance reimbursement special fund, into which will be 12 deposited reimbursements received from the United States Social 13 Security Administration on behalf of recipients who have been 14 retroactively approved for supplemental security income after 15 receiving state-funded interim assistance payments. The special fund will be used for state-funded financial assistance payments 16 **17** and for programs that support and assist recipients to qualify 18 for supplemental security income.
- 19 SECTION 2. Chapter 346, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
 20 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
 21 and to read as follows:
