
A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII TUITION AND FEES SPECIAL FUND.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Section 304A-2153, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2 amended to read as follows:
- 3 " [†] §304A-2153 [‡] University of Hawaii tuition and fees
4 special fund. (a) There is established the University of
5 Hawaii tuition and fees special fund into which shall be
6 deposited all revenue collected by the university for regular,
7 summer, and continuing education credit tuition, tuition-related
8 course and fee charges, and any other charges to students,
9 except as provided by law. Moneys deposited into the fund shall
10 be expended to maintain or improve the university's programs and
11 operations and shall not be:
- 12 (1) Used as a justification for reducing any budget
13 request or allotment to the university unless the
14 university requests such a reduction;
- 15 (2) Transferred unless otherwise authorized by the
16 legislature; and



1 (3) Restricted by the governor or the director of finance
2 without the prior approval of the legislature.

3 Any rule, policy, or action of any agency or individual in
4 contravention of this subsection shall be void as against public
5 policy.

6 (b) Any law to the contrary notwithstanding, the board of
7 regents may authorize expenditures of up to \$3,000,000 annually,
8 excluding in-kind services, from this fund for the purposes of
9 promoting alumni relations and generating private donations for
10 deposit into the University of Hawaii Foundation for the
11 purposes of the university. Any expenditure authorized pursuant
12 to this subsection shall be for a public purpose and shall not
13 be subject to chapters 42F, 103, 103D, and 103F. The university
14 shall submit a comprehensive report to the legislature detailing
15 the use of any funds authorized by the board under this
16 subsection no later than twenty days prior to the convening of
17 each regular session.

18 The report shall:

19 (1) Identify each department of the University of Hawaii
20 Foundation supported by moneys from the fund;



- 1 (2) Describe the purposes and activities of each
2 department identified in paragraph (1) and how it
3 participates in fundraising activities and benefits
4 the university;
- 5 (3) Provide the total expenditures of each department
6 identified in paragraph (1) by primary expense
7 categories;
- 8 (4) Identify all moneys from the fund transferred to any
9 fund of the university and provide a justification of
10 how these moneys are used to benefit the university;
- 11 (5) Provide a financial summary of the operating
12 activities of the University of Hawaii Foundation,
13 including revenues and expenditures by major reporting
14 categories; and
- 15 (6) Identify amounts and purposes of all expenditures from
16 the University of Hawaii support fund.
- 17 (c) Any law to the contrary notwithstanding, the
18 university may transfer funds from the University of Hawaii
19 tuition and fees special fund into the scholarship and
20 assistance special fund established pursuant to section [†]304A-
21 2159 [†].



1 (d) In estimating its quarterly budget requirements, each
2 campus of the University of Hawaii shall prepare a plan for the
3 fiscal year for the operation of each of the programs that it is
4 responsible for administering. The operations plan shall be:

5 (1) In such form and content as the vice president for
6 budget and finance and chief financial officer of the
7 University of Hawaii may prescribe; and

8 (2) Submitted, together with the estimated quarterly
9 budget requirements, to the vice president for budget
10 and finance and chief financial officer on such date
11 as the vice president for budget and finance and chief
12 financial officer may prescribe.

13 (e) The president and vice president for budget and
14 finance and chief financial officer of the University of Hawaii:

15 (1) Shall review the operations plan for each campus to
16 determine if:

17 (A) It is consistent with the policy decisions of the
18 board of regents and appropriations by the
19 legislature;

20 (B) It reflects proper planning and efficient
21 management methods; and



1 (C) Appropriations have been made for the planned
2 purpose and will not be exhausted before the end
3 of the fiscal year;

4 (2) Shall approve the operations plan for each campus if
5 they determine that the operations plan meets the
6 requirements of paragraph (1); and

7 (3) May modify or withhold the planned expenditures of any
8 campus at any time during the appropriations period.

9 (f) At the end of each fiscal year, the moneys in the
10 University of Hawaii tuition and fees special fund for each
11 campus shall lapse to the credit of program identification
12 number UOH900 (University of Hawaii, system wide support)."

13 SECTION 2. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
14 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

15 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2015.



Report Title:

University of Hawaii; Special Fund

Description:

Requires each UH campus to prepare an operations plan, to be reviewed by the President and VP for Budget and Finance and CFO of UH, for each fiscal year. Requires the moneys in the UH Tuition and Fees Special Fund for each UH campus to lapse to the credit of Program ID No. UOH900 (University of Hawaii, system wide support). (HB541 CD1)

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
