SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE CONVENING OF A TASK FORCE TO ASSESS THE SCOPE AND FEASIBILITY OF ESTABLISHING A CENTRALIZED FILING SYSTEM FOR ADVANCE CARE PLANNING FORMS THAT CAN BE ACCESSED BY ALL HEALTH FACILITIES.

1 WHEREAS, advance care planning forms such as a health care
2 power of attorney, provider's orders for life-sustaining
3 treatment, and advance health care directive are important
4 documents that ensure individual health care wishes are honored
5 by medical professionals; and

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7 WHEREAS, it is critical that advance care planning forms be
8 readily and quickly available to medical staff; and

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10 WHEREAS, medical care is not always provided by a patient's
11 established primary care provider due to emergency or unforeseen
12 circumstances; and

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14 WHEREAS, a centralized filing system for advance care
15 planning forms would allow all health facilities in the State to
16 have immediate access to patients' health care wishes; now,
17 therefore,

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19 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Twenty-eighth
20 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2015, the
21 House of Representatives concurring, that the Director of Health
22 is requested to convene a task force to assess the scope and
23 feasibility of establishing a centralized filing system for
24 advance care planning forms that can be accessed by all health
25 facilities; and

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27 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the task force focus on a
28 centralized filing system for documents including an
29 individual's health care power of attorney, provider's orders
30 for life-sustaining treatment, advance health care directive,
31 and any other form the Director of Health deems relevant; and



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 2 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Director of Health or the
 3 Director's designee serve as the chairperson of the task force;
 4 and

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 6 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Director of Health or the
 7 Director's designee choose the members of the task force;
 8 provided that the members include or represent hospitals, health
 9 care facilities, nursing homes, an attorney experienced in
 10 hospital administration, the University of Hawaii Elder Law
 11 Program, and any other entities the Director deems appropriate;
 12 and

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 14 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the task force submit a report
 15 of its findings and recommendations, including any proposed
 16 legislation, to the Legislature no later than twenty days prior
 17 to the convening of the Regular Session of 2016; and

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 19 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the task force be dissolved on
 20 June 30, 2017; and

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 22 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this
 23 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Director of Health
 24 and Director of the University of Hawaii Elder Law Program.
