SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE HIGH TECHNOLOGY DEVELOPMENT CORPORATION TO
ESTABLISH A WORKING GROUP TO EXAMINE THE ESTABLISHMENT OF A
FIRST RESPONDERS TECHNOLOGY CAMPUS AND COMMAND CENTER IN
CENTRAL OAHU.

1 WHEREAS, the State requires a plan to relocate public
2 safety services located within and nearby inundation zones to a
3 centralized non-inundation zone area that will provide direct
4 access to highways and be in convenient proximity to hospital
5 and military services and assistance; and
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7 WHEREAS, in the event of a major disaster, critical systems
8 could be unavailable for months, negatively impacting the lives
9 of many tens of thousands of citizens and costing the State tens
10 of millions of dollars in unplanned system recovery and restart
11 costs; and
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13 WHEREAS, the current data center environment is not
14 fulfilling the capacity, reliability, and security needs of the
15 various departments; and
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17 WHEREAS, the existence of more than thirty low-quality data
18 centers, which are poorly secured and monitored and completely
19 unmanned more than 65 percent of the time, exposes the State to
20 the possibility of significant physical and cyber security
21 breaches, resulting in the loss of confidential information
22 about our most vulnerable citizens; and
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24 WHEREAS, compromising citizens' security and damaging the
25 reputation of the State as a trustworthy data custodian could
26 expose the State to tens of millions of dollars in liability and
27 remediation costs; and
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29 WHEREAS, the High Technology Development Corporation, in
30 collaboration with the Department of Accounting and General
31 Services and the Chief Information Officer, has the ability to



1 oversee the design, construction, and operation of a data center
2 that can house the centralized computing resources along with
3 key staff that support and maintain these resources; now,
4 therefore,
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6 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Twenty-eighth
7 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2015, the
8 House of Representatives concurring, that the High Technology
9 Development Corporation is requested to convene a working group
10 to examine the establishment of a first responders technology
11 campus and cyber security command center in central Oahu to
12 centralize first responders and cyber security facilities and
13 enable the sharing of resources and support services; and
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15 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the High Technology Development
16 Corporation is encouraged to include in the working group
17 representatives from the:

- 18 (1) Hawaii National Guard;
- 19 (2) Hawaii Army National Guard;
- 20 (3) Hawaii State Civil Defense;
- 21 (4) Department of Public Safety - Sheriff Division;
- 22 (5) High Technology Development Corporation;
- 23 (6) Department of Accounting and General Services - Office
24 of Information Management and Technology;
- 25 (7) Honolulu Fire Department;
- 26 (8) Honolulu Police Department; and
- 27 (9) Honolulu Emergency Medical Services; and

28 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the members choose a chair of
29 the working group from among themselves; and
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31 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the working group examine and
32 make recommendations regarding the following issues, at minimum:
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- (1) A plan to establish a first responders technology campus and cyber security command center in central Oahu;
- (2) Potential funding sources and financial opportunities for the campus and command center;
- (3) Staffing needs of the campus and command center; and
- (4) Potential sites within Central Oahu and designs for the campus and command center; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the members of the working group serve without compensation but be reimbursed for expenses, including travel expenses, necessary for the performance of their duties; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the working group is requested to submit a report of its findings and recommendations, including any proposed legislation, to the Legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of the Regular Session of 2016; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the working group be dissolved on June 30, 2016; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Adjutant General, Director of Public Safety, Chief Executive Officer of the High Technology Development Corporation, Comptroller, Fire Chief of the Honolulu Fire Department, Chief of the Honolulu Police Department, and Chief of the Honolulu Emergency Medical Services.
