The following measure(s) were previously heard on Friday, February 06, 2015.

<u>HB 584</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO VIOLENCE AGAINST HEALTH CARE PERSONNEL. Amends the offense of assault in the second degree as it applies to medical professionals by expanding the types of medical services providers protected under this offense. Clarifies that assault in the second degree does not apply to patients receiving medical services outside of an emergency room.	HLT, JUD
<u>HB 34</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATED TO SMOKING. Allows condominiums and cooperative housing corporations to adopt rules to prohibit smoking in units, common elements, or limited common elements.	HLT, CPC
<u>HB 728</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO INSURANCE. Requires a health organization to annually disclose de-identified claims data to Insurance Commissioner. Requires Insurance Commissioner to annually disclose de-identified claims data to a large group purchaser upon request. Exempts de-identified claims data from public disclosure except as provided. Makes conforming amendments.	HLT, CPC/JUD
<u>HB 864</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO IN VITRO FERTILIZATION INSURANCE COVERAGE. Provides insurance coverage equality for women who are diagnosed with infertility by making available to them expanded treatment options, ensuring adequate and affordable health care services.	HLT, CPC
<u>HB 673</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO FERTILITY RIGHTS OF CANCER PATIENTS. Requires insurance coverage for embryo, oocyte, and sperm cryopreservation procedures to preserve the fertility of adults diagnosed with cancer who have not yet started cancer treatment.	HLT, CPC, FIN



<u>HB 513</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO CONTROLLED SUBSTANCES. Requires the signature of the patient or an authorized agent when delivering prescribed controlled substances by mail.	HLT, CPC, JUD
<u>HB 253</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO VACCINATIONS. Authorizes pharmacists to administer vaccines to persons between 14 and 17 years of age who have a prescription from a collaborating physician.	HLT, CPC
<u>HB 512</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO PHARMACY BENEFIT MANAGERS. Requires pharmacy benefit managers to register each year with DCCA.	HLT, CPC
<u>HB 1075</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO HEALTH. Authorizes the Maui Regional System to enter into an agreement with a private entity to transition one or more of its facilities into a new private Hawaii nonprofit corporation.	HLT, LAB, FIN
<u>HB 1112</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO THE HAWAII HEALTH SYSTEMS CORPORATION. Establishes a process for determining whether the health care services provided by the Hawaii Health Systems Corporation or one or more of its regional health care systems can be delivered more cost-effectively by partnering with a private health care management system.	HLT, FIN
<u>HB 1420</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO THE HAWAII HEALTH SYSTEMS CORPORATION. Repeals the regional system boards of the HHSC. Increases the size of the HHSC board and changes its composition.	HLT, CPC, FIN
<u>HB 1254</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO PUBLIC HEALTH FACILITIES. Repeals HHSC. Reestablishes the division of community hospitals under DOH.	HLT, FIN
<u>HB 1146</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO COLLECTIVE BARGAINING IN PUBLIC EMPLOYMENT. Creates seven separate collective bargaining units for employees of the Hawaii Health Systems Corporation.	HLT, LAB, FIN
<u>HB 1145</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO THE HAWAII HEALTH SYSTEMS CORPORATION. Authorizes the Hawaii Health Systems Corporation to mortgage its real property and clarifies the dollar cap on municipal leasing authority.	HLT, WAL, FIN
