HB 390
Status

RELATING TO EMPLOYMENT AGREEMENTS.
Prohibits noncompete agreements and restrictive covenants in employment contracts, post-employment contracts, or separation agreements that forbid post-employment competition of licensed physicians.

HB 796
Status

RELATING TO INSURANCE.
Requires an entity to send written notice to a health care provider at least thirty calendar days prior to initiating any recoupment or offset demand efforts. Prohibits an entity from initiating any recoupment or offset efforts more than twelve months after an initial claim payment was received by a health care provider, with specific exceptions.

HB 1283
Status

RELATING TO THE HAWAII HEALTH CONNECTOR.
Retains current financial and service benefits of the Hawaii health connector. Enhances the availability of services through the connector. Supports the self-sustainability of the connector by 2023 by enabling the connector to issue debentures issued in the name of the connector.

HB 1467
Status

RELATING TO THE HAWAII HEALTH CONNECTOR.
Enables the Hawaii health connector to offer large group coverage to insurers. Requires insurer participation in the connector if an insurer has a share of the small group market in the State that exceeds 20 per cent. Expands the potential small businesses market in the connector by amending the current definition of "small employer" under section 431:2-201.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes. Beginning January 1, 2016, ends transitional renewal policies in Hawaii. Requires health insurers to provide notice to group health plans offering continuation coverage about options to secure affordable coverage under the connector.

<u>HB 1108</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO HEALTH. Requires health insurers, mutual benefit societies, and health maintenance organizations to provide coverage for autism spectrum disorder treatments.	HLT, CPC, FIN
<u>HB 1377</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO CHILD HEALTH. Makes an appropriation to develop the specifications and pricing for, as well as an implementation plan, for a web-based data system in the early intervention section of the department of health. Makes an appropriation for operating expenses and to establish one permanent coordinator position in the children with special health needs branch of the department of health to improve social-emotional and behavioral outcomes for children birth to age five years.	HLT, FIN
<u>HB 1440</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO EDUCATION. Appropriates funds for the Hawaii Keiki: Healthy and Ready to Learn program. Requires matching funds.	HLT, FIN
<u>HB 10, HD1</u> <u>(HSCR50)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO EDUCATION. Authorizes Department of Education (DOE) employees and agents to volunteer to administer auto-injectable epinephrine to a student with anaphylaxis in an emergency situation and to assist in the testing and management of diabetes for students. Allows students with diabetes to self-test and self-manage their illness. Requires DOE to report on the status of implementation. (HB10 HD1)	EDN, HLT, FIN
<u>HB 861</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO HEALTH. Requires the Department of Education to provide care to students with diabetes pursuant to a student's diabetes medical management plan.	HLT, EDN, FIN
<u>HB 458</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO HEALTH. Beginning with the 2016-2017 school year, requires public schools to annually provide information about the human papillomavirus, including the connection between human papillomavirus to cervical and other cancers and diseases, and the availability of vaccines against the human papillomavirus to parents or guardians of students entering sixth grade.	HLT, EDN
<u>HB 459</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO HEALTH. Specifies additional elements of Hawaii's existing sexuality health education law and its implementation. Requires the DOE to provide certain types of information to the public and to parents. Allows parents to opt out of the DOE's sexuality health education.	HLT, EDN
<u>HB 1437</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO HEALTH. Mandates a food establishment to sell or offer for sale only bottled water or low-fat milk for beverage as part of a children's meal.	HLT, JUD, FIN
<u>HB 1438</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO BEVERAGES. Requires all sweetened beverages to contain a warning label.	HLT, CPC, JUD

DECISION MAKING TO FOLLOW



Persons wishing to offer comments should submit testimony at least 24 hours prior to the hearing. Testimony should indicate:

- Testifier's name with position/title and organization;
- The Committee(s) to which the comments are directed;
- The date and time of the hearing; and
- Measure number.

While every effort will be made to incorporate all testimony received, materials received on the day of the hearing or improperly identified or directed, may be distributed to the Committee after the hearing.

PAPER: 15 copies (including an original) to Room 331 in the State Capitol;


