RELATING TO TRANSPORTATION.  
Clarifies the authority of the department of transportation at  
Dillingham Airfield. (SD1)

(SSCR619)  
Status

RELATING TO TOWING.  
Establishes definitions of "hooked up", "scene", and "vehicle owner" to  
clarify when a vehicle must be released by a towing company. Permits  
a towing charge of \$30 for difficult hookups. Specifies that a tow  
company is not obligated to drop a tow if the vehicle is hooked up,  
outside of the scene, and the tow operator is in motion. Establishes  
date and time stamped photo as proof of vehicle being hooked up.  
Effective 07/01/2050. (SD2)

Status

RELATING TO HIGHWAY SAFETY.  
Establishes driver licensing reciprocity privileges between Hawaii and  
foreign countries upon certain conditions. Repeals the driver's license  
reciprocity committee. Effective 01/07/2059. (SD1)

SB 1280, SD2  
(SSCR878)  
Status

RELATING TO TRANSPORTATION NETWORK COMPANIES.  
Requires the public utilities commission to regulate transportation  
network companies and transportation network company drivers.  
Establishes insurance requirements and qualifications for persons who  
operate or serve as drivers for transportation network companies.  
Appropriates funds to the PUC. Effective 7/1/2053. (SD2)

DECISION MAKING TO FOLLOW

PAPER: 1 copies (including an original) to Room 328 in the State Capitol;


