Makes an appropriation for personnel services, current expenses,  
equipment, and motor vehicles of the division of conservation and  
resources enforcement. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD2)

RELATING TO HISTORIC PRESERVATION.  
Amends the definition of "historic property" to require that fifty-year-  
old privately owned single family residences be considered historic  
properties for purposes of chapter 6E, Hawaii Revised Statutes, only if  
the property is listed or eligible for listing on the Hawaii register of  
historic places or is located in a historic district. Requires the state  
historic preservation division of the department of land and natural  
resources to conduct a survey on properties eligible for listing on the  
Hawaii register of historic places and to provide owners of historic  
property with notice of the property's likely eligibility. Requires a  
report to the legislature. Effective 7/1/2050. Repeals 12/31/2018.

use permit to moor a vessel in a state small boat harbor.

DECISION MAKING TO FOLLOW

Persons wishing to offer comments should submit testimony at least 24 hours prior to the hearing. Testimony should indicate:

- Testifier's name with position/title and organization;
- The Committee(s) to which the comments are directed;
- The date and time of the hearing; and
- Measure number.

While every effort will be made to incorporate all testimony received, materials received on the day of the hearing or improperly identified or directed, may be distributed to the Committee after the hearing.

Submit testimony in ONE of the following ways:

PAPER: 1 copy (including an original) to Room 316 in the State Capitol;

FAX: For testimony less than 5 pages in length, transmit to 808-586-8494 (Oahu) or 1-800-535-3859 (for Neighbor Islander without a computer to submit testimony through e-mail or the Web); or


WEB: For testimony less than 10MB in size, transmit from <http://www.capitol.hawaii.gov/submittestimony.aspx>.

Testimony submitted will be placed on the legislative website. This public posting of testimony on the website should be considered when including personal information in your testimony.

**If during the course of the hearing it appears that there will not be sufficient time to allow everyone to be heard, the chairperson reserves the right to limit the remaining testifiers to three minutes. This three minute policy will be enforced to ensure fairness and adequate consideration to all bills.**
