A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CHARTER SCHOOLS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that certain department
2 of education schools, such as those located in leeward Oahu, are
3 operating at full or near-full capacity while struggling with
4 severe overcrowding on campuses, even while providing multi-
5 track schedules. Public school capacity concerns have also been
6 raised in connection with the projected construction of
7 residential high-rises in the Kakaako community development
8 district.

9 The legislature further finds that section 302D-13, Hawaii
10 Revised Statutes, provides for the creation of start-up public
11 charter schools, which could be an important part of the
12 solution to school overcrowding. In addition, start-up charter
13 schools can often be established in a shorter time period than
14 it takes to construct and open a new department of education
15 school. Section 302D-14.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, sets forth
16 the start-up process between the state public charter school



1 commission's approval of a pre-opening school and the opening of
2 the charter school to students.

3 The legislature additionally finds that the state public
4 charter school commission, in its 2015-2016 request for
5 proposals for new public charter schools, has identified the
6 following priority needs for applications:

7 (1) New schools that would provide additional school
8 capacity in geographic areas where existing department
9 of education schools are already exceeding, have
10 already reached, or are projected to reach or exceed,
11 full enrollment capacity; and

12 (2) New schools that would serve communities where
13 existing department of education schools are not
14 performing well academically, as measured by the
15 State's strive HI performance system and other student
16 outcomes, and that present a plan for improving these
17 outcomes.

18 The legislature also finds that although in the past, the
19 State provided start-up grants to assist newly approved public
20 charter schools with their pre-opening costs before operating
21 funds became available, pre-opening charter schools currently



1 have no such state assistance in meeting these significant
2 challenges.

3 The purpose of this Act is to provide funding for start-up
4 grants to assist one or more newly approved pre-opening charter
5 schools that will meet the priority needs identified by the
6 state public charter school commission.


7 SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general
8 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$200,000 or so much
9 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2016-2017 to provide
10 start-up grants to newly approved pre-opening public charter
11 schools that will meet the priority needs identified by the
12 state public charter school commission in its request for
13 proposals for new schools; provided that the state public
14 charter school commission shall establish grant criteria and
15 guidelines for use of public funds.

16 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the state public
17 charter school commission for the purposes of this Act.

18 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2016.
