

RELATING TO ENTERPRISE TECHNOLOGY SERVICES


Chair Tokuda and members of the Committee, thank you for the opportunity to testify on S.B. 2807 SD1. The Department of Accounting and General Services (DAGS) supports S.B. 2807 SD1.

By consolidating the Office of Information Management and Technology (OIMT) and the Information and Communication Services Division (ICSD), S.B. 2807 SD1 represents an opportunity to improve the delivery of technology services through the consolidation of two programs already led by the Chief Information Officer (CIO) of the State of Hawai`i.

In establishing the CIO position, Act 200, SLH 2010, transferred supervision and oversight of ICSD to the new, governor-appointed position to ensure that operations in statewide information processing and telecommunications services align with statewide governance and strategic plans.

This reorganization will not only facilitate the fulfillment of ICSD's functions and responsibilities but also ensure that current modernization efforts are carried out in a coordinated and "enterprise" fashion.



SENATE BILL NO. 2807, S.D. 1
RELATING TO ENTERPRISE TECHNOLOGY SERVICES

Chair Tokuda, Vice Chair Dela Cruz, and Members of the Committee:

I am Todd Nacapuy, Chief Information Officer (CIO) of the State of Hawai‘i, testifying in **support** of Senate Bill No. 2807, S.D. 1, which proposes to create greater efficiency and effectiveness in State government by formally combining into one office the information technology functions now performed by two separate programs presently overseen by the CIO.

With these changes, the Office of Information Management and Technology (OIMT) and the Information and Communication Services Division (ICSD) in the Department of Accounting and General Services (DAGS) will be unified to create, within DAGS, the Office of Enterprise Technology Services (ETS) directed by the CIO.

Pending the formal reorganization, we are implementing, as one cohesive “ETS” team, new IT governance processes under Administrative Directive No. 15-02. As such, correspondence, websites and social media accounts now reflect the new ETS name, and the CIO role is clearly defined as the State’s information technology leader.

We have developed these new IT governance processes, policies, procedures and guidelines, pursuant to Sections 41 and 42 of Act 119, Session Laws of Hawai‘i 2015, and have begun implemented and applying governance to IT projects cited in Act 119 as well as other IT projects greater than \$1 million or categorized as CIO priority projects.

Additionally, to further strengthen the comprehensive IT governance as well as IT security governance provisions in Act 119, we wish to propose that additional language be added to S.B No. 2807, S.D.1., to replace Section 3, subsection (a) item (4) as follows:

(4) Work with all executive branch departments and agencies to develop and maintain their respective multi-year information technology strategic and tactical plans/roadmaps that are part of the state's overall information technology strategic plans/roadmaps and directions; coordinate all department and agency information technology budget requests, forecasts, and subsequent procurements to ensure that they comply with those strategic plans/roadmaps, and with the office of enterprise technology services' information technology governance processes and enterprise architecture policies/standards (systems, services, hardware, software, and security management).

Other proposed changes in S.B No. 2807, S.D.1., similarly support the intent of improving the IT governance review processes.
