
A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CEMETERIES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that Sunset Memorial Park
2 in Pearl City, Oahu, has been neglected for years and has been
3 the focal point of numerous complaints by people who have family
4 members buried there. The cemetery has been described as having
5 a damaged mausoleum, sinking graves, and broken, missing, or
6 obscured grave markers that are hidden by overgrown vegetation.

7 Since the death of its previous owner, Sunset Memorial Park
8 has had no registered owner on record. Volunteers have tried to
9 maintain the cemetery, but have reluctantly stopped because of
10 state liability issues.

11 The dilapidated, unsightly state of Sunset Memorial Park is
12 of great concern not only for the families whose loved ones are
13 buried there, but for the surrounding community as well. The
14 Park has fallen into such disrepair that public safety and
15 health are at issue. A viable solution to this problem is long
16 overdue.



1 Attempts to have the State add Sunset Memorial Park to its
2 list of four currently state-owned cemeteries in Aiea, Kapalama,
3 Alewa Heights, and Makiki are ongoing. The last time the State
4 took over a cemetery was in 1946.

5 It has been reported that the department of commerce and
6 consumer affairs is actively looking for a long-term solution
7 for Sunset Memorial Park and is considering all options.

8 The purpose of this Act is to:

- 9 (1) Require the director of commerce and consumer affairs,
10 in consultation with the comptroller, to develop
11 strategies for the upkeep, repair, and maintenance of
12 Sunset Memorial Park;
- 13 (2) Authorize the director of commerce and consumer
14 affairs to access the Sunset Memorial Trust Fund to
15 pay for the repair and maintenance of the cemetery;
16 and
- 17 (3) Limit liability for persons maintaining or repairing
18 cemetery grounds.

19 SECTION 2. Chapter 662D, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
20 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
21 and to read as follows:



1 "662D- Limited liability for persons maintaining or
2 repairing cemetery grounds. (a) A volunteer who maintains or
3 repairs cemetery grounds located in the State, including
4 cemeteries operated for profit pursuant to chapter 441, shall
5 not be liable to any person for injury or damage sustained as a
6 result of the actions of the volunteer to maintain or repair the
7 cemetery grounds, except for injury or damages resulting from
8 gross negligence or intentional misconduct.

9 (b) A nonprofit organization, nonprofit corporation, or
10 other entity that provides volunteers to maintain or repair
11 cemetery grounds located in the State, including cemeteries
12 operated for profit pursuant to chapter 441, shall not be liable
13 to any person for injury or damage sustained as a result of the
14 actions of the volunteer provided by the organization,
15 corporation, or entity to maintain or repair the cemetery
16 grounds, except for injury or damages resulting from gross
17 negligence or intentional misconduct.

18 (c) This section does not relieve any cemetery property
19 owner or cemetery authority from compliance with the
20 requirements of chapter 441.



1 (d) A volunteer providing services under this section for
2 a nonprofit organization, nonprofit corporation, or other entity
3 may only receive reimbursement for actual expenses incurred that
4 have been authorized for payment by the nonprofit organization,
5 nonprofit corporation, or other entity.

6 (e) Nothing herein shall be construed to authorize or
7 permit the use of perpetual care funds for the purposes of
8 reimbursing costs incurred pursuant to this section.

9 (f) Notwithstanding any other law to the contrary, actions
10 of a volunteer in conformance with this section shall not
11 require licensure under chapter 441; provided that maintenance
12 and repair activities covered under this section shall be
13 limited to general maintenance, care, and preservation of
14 cemeteries including keeping sod or grass in repair and caring
15 for trees and shrubs, but shall not include activities related
16 to burials.

17 (g) For purposes of this section, a volunteer may provide
18 maintenance and repair services as an individual and not as a
19 member or affiliate of a cemetery authority, nonprofit
20 corporation, nonprofit organization, or other entity, if the
21 volunteer:



- 1 (1) First seeks approval from the cemetery owner or
- 2 cemetery authority, if one can be identified; and
- 3 (2) Does not receive compensation or other reimbursement."

4 SECTION 3. (a) The director of commerce and consumer
5 affairs, in consultation with the comptroller, shall develop
6 both short-term and long-term strategies for the upkeep, repair,
7 and maintenance of Sunset Memorial Park in Pearl City, Oahu.

8 (b) The director of commerce and consumer affairs shall
9 examine all options for repairing and maintaining Sunset
10 Memorial Park, including the feasibility of having the State
11 take ownership of Sunset Memorial Park.

12 (c) The director of commerce and consumer affairs may
13 access the Sunset Memorial Trust Fund to address repair and
14 maintenance issues of Sunset Memorial Park; provided that the
15 director of commerce and consumer affairs makes a detailed
16 accounting of expenses paid from the fund.

17 (d) The director of commerce and consumer affairs shall
18 report findings and recommendations related to activities
19 conducted pursuant to this section, including any proposed
20 legislation, to the legislature no later than twenty days prior
21 to the convening of the regular session of 2018.

1 SECTION 4. New statutory material is underscored.

2 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.
