TECHNICAL SCHOOLS.
Clarifies the scope of the private trade, vocational, and technical school
licensure program within the department of education. Establishes a
licensing fee to ensure the sustainability of the licensure program.
Establishes a license renewal process and fee. Creates the private
trade, vocational, and technical school licensure special fund.
Appropriates moneys for one full-time equivalent position within the
department of education to administer licensing. Effective 07/01/2050.

Proposes amendments to the Constitution of the State of Hawaii to advance the State's goal of providing a public education for the children of Hawaii by authorizing the legislature to establish, as provided by law, a surcharge on residential investment property and visitor accommodations. (SD2)

SB 686, SD2
(SSCR881)
Status

RELATING TO EDUCATION FUNDING. EDN, JUD, FIN
Establishes an education surcharge on residential investment properties and visitor accommodations for the purpose of funding public education. Effective July 1, 2050. (SD2)

DECISION MAKING TO FOLLOW

Testimony submitted will be placed on the legislative website. This public posting of testimony on the website should be considered when including personal information in your testimony.
