SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

ENCOURAGING THE DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE TO EVALUATE THE IMPORT
REQUIREMENTS AND PROCESS FOR DOMESTIC ANIMALS.

1 WHEREAS, Hawaii's current system for importing domestic
2 animals into the state is outdated, complicated, and exploitive;
3 and
4

5 WHEREAS, current Department of Agriculture rules require
6 dogs, cats, and other carnivores originating from the United
7 States and other non-exempted areas, upon arrival in the State,
8 to be confined to a quarantine station for a period up to one
9 hundred twenty days to prevent the introduction of rabies to the
10 State; and
11

12 WHEREAS, the import process is lengthy, costly, and
13 stressful for both the pet owner and animals; and

15 WHEREAS, possible improvements to the process include:

17 (1) Updates so that the entire import process can
18 transpire online;

20 (2) Discounted rates and special accommodations for
21 service animals; and

23 (3) Pricing regulations for veterinarians who do airport
24 checkups on neighbor islands;

28 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Twenty-ninth
29 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2018, the
30 House of Representatives concurring, that the Department of
31 Agriculture is encouraged to evaluate the import requirements
32 and process for domestic animals; and

1 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Agriculture
2 is requested to report to the Legislature, no later than twenty
3 days prior to the convening of the Regular Session of 2019, its
4 findings and any recommendations on how to improve the import
5 process for domestic animals to make it easier and more fair
6 while remaining effective in preventing rabies and parasites
7 from entering Hawaii; and

9 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a certified copy of this
10 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Chairperson of the
11 Board of Agriculture.
