A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PUBLIC EMPLOYMENT COST ITEMS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 PART I

2 SECTION 1. There are appropriated or authorized from the
3 sources of funding indicated below to collective bargaining
4 statewide (BUF 102) the following sums or so much thereof as may
5 be necessary to fund for fiscal biennium 2017-2019 all
6 collective bargaining cost items in the agreement negotiated
7 with the exclusive bargaining representatives of collective
8 bargaining unit (14):

13 SECTION 2. Funds appropriated or authorized by this part

17 SECTION 5. Salary increases and cost adjustments provided
 18 in this Act for any officer or employee whose compensation is
 19 paid, in whole or in part, from federal, special, or other funds
 20 shall be paid wholly or proportionately, as the case may be,
 21 from the respective funds.

1 SECTION 6. Funds appropriated or authorized by this Act
2 that are not expended or encumbered by June 30, 2019 shall lapse
3 as of that date.

4 SECTION 7. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
